ABOVE AND BEYOND

The following citation and a plaque were presented to John Bryant at the KLA Awards Luncheon in Louisville on October 13, 1989:

The Academic Section is pleased to honor John Maxey Bryant as the recipient of this year's Outstanding Academic Librarian Award. John is no stranger to those in this room. For the last fifteen years or so, he has successfully guided Technical Services at the University of Kentucky into an automated environment, overseen the facilities planning and development there, and coordinated the celebration of the libraries' two-millionth volume. He is a past Academic Section chair and past president of the Ohio Valley Group of Technical Services Librarians. Those of you who have attended one of his conferences--including this fine one--may not fully appreciate John's organizational skills, so seamlessly designed and executed are his meetings. Not least of all, John is a mainstay of the UK library school's part-time faculty, and by now has trained a generation of librarians in this state and

abroad through his cataloging and technical-services courses.

A few years ago John was given the rather amorphous mission of doing something about the automation effort in the community-college libraries. This year has seen the fruition of his remarkable labors toward that goal. The fifteen campuses of the UK community-college system have brought up a union database of their holdings and are beginning to use it for catalog control, circulation, and interlibrary loan. Those who have had the good fortune--as I have--to play around with their system and to glance at their e-mail traffic have seen a vital, developing network in action. John has somehow brought together the organizational commitment, the money, the equipment, and the will of his colleagues to accomplish this (not to mention traveling the breadth of the Commonwealth, from Paducah to Prestonsburg). John is justifiably proud of his innovative network, and likes to show it off--just last month at the KHECC conference in Frankfort, for example, and this past spring through an invited paper at

the National Online Meeting in New York City. We all will be hearing lots more about what has been tentatively named the Community College Library Information Network, or CCLIN (CLEAN) for short. For his pioneering efforts as Mr. CCLIN" and for his leadership in KLA, Academic Section salutes the man at the head table here as its Outstanding Academic Librarian for 1989...
