In the absence of Dean Roberts, the name of Eugene Thomas McClure was presented by Professor Miller for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture.

On motion of Professor Miller the following resolution was adopted:

"BE IT RESOLVED that this faculty convene regularly on the second Monday of each month at 3:45 P.M., and in case the President is not able to be present at the meeting in person, it shall be presided over by some dean appointed by him.

BE IT RESOLVED That a committee of five, including the Registrar, be appointed on the classification of proposed Faculty Legislation.

It shall be the duty of this committee to receive and classify all proposed Faculty Legislation, separating routine business from subjects which are likely to require discussion. This proposed legislation, thus classified, will then be mimeographed and a copy be furnished to each member of the faculty at least one week in advance of the regular faculty meeting. When the faculty meets, the President will first call for a report of this committee, and members of the faculty will be given an opportunity to move for the transfer of business from the routine to the debatable class. The routine schedule of business with these transfers stricken out will then be presented en bloc for faculty approval.

The bringing up before the faculty for discussion of any new business not previously acted upon by this committee, will require a two-thirds vote of the faculty. "

After a general discussion to referent to the above of our regular faculty meeting, the following resolution was adopted:

The report of the Chapel Committee, after being amended,
was adopted as follows:

"The Convocation Committee begs to report that the attendance upon the weekly convocation exercises upon Tuesday is very irregular and often very small. The committee is frequently embarrassed by the fact that men of distinction who are ^{our} guests on these occasions are paid scant courtesy in that such small and scattered audiences assemble to represent our great body of a thousand students. Your committee believes that the great majority of our students would profit by and enjoy the program now provided at the convocation exercises, if the habit of attendance were once formed. . . With the purpose, therefore, of better maintaining the dignity and success of the convocation exercises, which you, as a faculty, have authorized, and of bringing to our student body the message of help and inspiration which are presented there, and which are worthy of an attentive hearing.

Your committee recommends that the members of the Cadet Battalion be required to assemble in military formation on Tuesday, and that other male ^{to} members of the freshman and sophomore classes be ^{required} ~~and~~ attend the exercises in a body.

It is recommended further that the Dean of Women be requested to arrange for a full attendance of the women students also. "
