Welcome

If you're using this map, we feel that you are a vistor or a newcomer to the Lexington Campus of the University of Kentucky. We believe you will find UK's students, faculty and staff friendly and helpful. Naturally we are proud of the University and the progress it is making toward serving the educational needs of the people of the Commonwealth.

If you have been away from the campus for some time, you may be surprised at UK's rapid growth and change. The 19-story Patterson Office Tower and White Hall Classroom Building with adjoining mall has given a new look to the central campus area. In addition to the post office, mailing center and other service facilities in the Classroom basement, this attractive four-level structure accommodates nearly 4,000 students at one time. Consequently, students find many of their classes in the same building, or in other buildings close by on the central campus.

The Tower houses many of the offices of the Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Library Science, Social Professions, and Graduate School. It also is headquarters for Student Affairs offices, Patterson School and others. A lobby on the top floor gives a spectacular view of the campus, metropolitan Lexington and the surrounding Bluegrass area.

Recently, most of the sod has been broken on the extreme South side of the campus. A new nine-story concrete structure, primarily for animal sciences, now breaks the skyline just behind the original Agricultural Science Center. Across Cooper Drive is UK's new football stadium, scheduled for completion in 1973.

The new agriculture building, windowless on two sides, was designed to accommodate about half offices and half laboratories in the central core area. Offices face windows, but labs—some with "atmospheres" precisely controlled—are sealed with no exposed surfaces to the outside. At the ground level, and extending beneath a mall area, are live animal accommodations, coolers and labs for meat research and the University dairy product research facility. The original Agriculture Science building houses mainly plant science offices and labs as well as the administrative offices of the college.

Just across University Drive from the Ag Science Center, and near the Blanding-Kirwan high rise dorm complex, is the new geometrically designed Don Cash Seaton Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building. It is a favorite of nearly all the students. With a large, versatile gym area that accommodates many of the popular team sports—and even several games simultaneously—the center provides facilities for a variety of body-building, recreational activities. It likewise has offices, classrooms and laboratories to support teaching and research functions.

Other new buildings include multi-discipline research laboratories adjacent to the Albert B. Chandler Medical Center and the College of Pharmacy, and modern, attractively-designed multi-level parking structures. Many of these new buildings have won architectural awards.

One of the first offices a student becomes acquainted with is the Dean of Admissions and Registrar. This office now is in the completely renovated Administration Annex. Walnut paneling and carpeting have given added charm to this long-time campus landmark.

Other offices serving daily needs of the students include Billings and Collections, second floor of the Service Building; Placement and Counseling and Testing services on the second and third floors of the Old Agriculture Building.

Many of the individual colleges have their own buildings such as Education, Law, Business and Economics, Home Economics, Engineering and Pharmacy. The Colleges of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing and Allied Health Professions are housed in the Medical Center with some offices just across the street in the Medical Center Annex.

At the hub of student activities is the UK Student Center with its ballrooms, theater, cafeteria, art gallery, bookstore, lounges, meeting rooms, offices and recreation facilities.

This is a part of the physical side of today's UK. There is much more, though. A new multi-million-dollar library expansion will greatly increase the use and convenience of the old King Library which now has to accommodate more than 20,000 students. Although the addition will be a separate building, the two structures will be connected by an enclosed walk-way.
