MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

October 15, 1934

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall Monday, October 15, 1934, with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of May 30 and August 15 were read and approved.

The Committee on Duplication of Work presented the following courses, which were approved:

College of Arts and Sciences

Chemistry 49a,b. Chemistry for Nurses. This course deals with those general principles of chemistry, inorganic, organic and physiological, which give the necessary foundation for practical work in nutrition, materia medica, and other subjects more or less dependent on a basis of chemical training. One hour lecture, one hour recitation, one hour laboratory a week each. Two credits each semester.
