Dear Brother

Your welcome letter together with Ellen's I received on the 28th of Feby & would have answered it before but I expected to be with you before this as it is I am in good health & my spirits are as light as a feather we have not got quite as good quarters here as we had in Tuscaloosa that is we have not got as good a place to exercise in we have either to stand up or lay down. you said in your last that George had got in to a new business I hope that he will have better luck than I have had I have about given up all hope of getting home for some time to come here is business now I suppose it is dull is it not - what is William doing & how does he get along & James if you don't see any chance of my getting out of here in a short time I would like a little money say five dollars or as much as you see fit to lend hoping that this will find you in good health I remain Your Brother
