I received your very kind &

& strength I received yours of Sept 19<sup>th</sup>  
we are all well as usual & I feel to praise  
the great Creator for his kind care over me  
& our little one & may your life be  
precious in his sight that we may  
be so happy as to meet a gain here  
below it is cool & raining to day the  
draft was put in force yesterday  
& I will try & give you some of the  
names of the men that were drafted
