in your letter providing you answer this. when
I hope you will, last winter when Mose Hunter
went home in Hurlough, I sent a new over coat
with him, which cost \$11.00. did father ever
get it, let me know, and when you do write I
wish you would give me all the particulars
of what has transpired within the past two
months, & I got a letter from one of the boys
of my Co. he was hurt with a musket in
the late battles, but he could not give me
a correct list of the killed & wounded in all
the late battles, if you know any thing in regard
to such & who all was wounded & killed let
me know, I would write to the Regt. but the
letters don't go through yet, but more than that
I expect to go to the Regt. in a few days myself.
this is Friday I think on Monday if no
preventing providence I will be on my journey.
when you receive this don't delay in answering it
direct it to this Hoop and if I am sent off, it
will be forwarded to me. I wrote to Deane
a few days ago I sent him one of my photographs
one General which was for you.

I will now draw my scribbling to a close, with the
hopes of having a speedy reply.

This pleasant-afternoon I am once
more seated to pen you a few lines with the hopes
it may find you still enjoying good health is it leaves
me. As you perceive, I have selected a large sheet
of paper with the intention of giving you the
history of what has transpired of late and how
sactly I have been neglected by you in regard
to not having received one single word in reply
to any of my letters which I have written to you
within the past month, I have not recd. a word
written by you since the 28th of April at which time
I was with my Regt. Camp at Rappahannock
Station Va. since that time I have written the
following letters. April 28th one letter to my Mother
when we was on the march at Branely Station.
in that letter I sent two photographs one of mine
& Capt. Geo. Stone. May the 2nd while in the Hoop
at Alexandria I wrote you a letter and stated for
you not to answer it until you would hear from
