Cambden Co Ky Feb <sup>The</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> 1864

Dear wife I take the opportunity of writing  
you a few lines to let you know that I am  
well at present and hoping these <sup>few</sup> lines will  
find you all enjoying the same blessing I have  
No more to retrocedly we will draw  $\frac{1}{8}$  of  
this month and then I am coming home  
I have seen a hard deal since I left home  
I have got the yellow fever now but not  
bad I am very well & satisfied Tell all  
of the children I want to see them all

Dear and Par I want to see them to if  
cant come I will my money how Par  
Par if cant come I want you to do  
do something my tobacco and fish I want  
you to get the balance of our thing.

Heame and wife bear of them and if  
I cant come home I want you all to  
rite to me Direct your letter to the  
13 Ky Calvary Co & in care of Captain  
Curry and to follow on so nothing more  
at only Remanding friend till Death.
