Mrs. Adkinson has charge of going over the exchanges.

I think I told Miss Ryan that our office rent was \$300. ^{a year} It was when we first moved in, & I forgot that it has since been raised to \$350.

It is further suggested that the Easter Offering next year be applied exclusively to the assistance undertaken by the General Convention to the Missionary work of the Church of England, which has been sorely stricken by war conditions.
