

This is homecoming. It is the one day of all the year set aside for the gathering of all the old boys and all the old girls who, in former years, pursued knowledge at old Kentucky.

Some of the homecomers still are youngsters while some are not so young any more. Some are awaiting the call to arms while a few bear the scars of two wars. But impending conflict notwithstanding, this is a day of gaiety, a day to thrill at the warm handclasp of an old friend, a day to glow in the memories of a bygone year. This is homecoming.

Perhaps this is the most significant of all homecomings ever held on the Kentucky campus because it marks half a century in Wildcat football . . . although our gridiron gladiators were not called Wildcats until 1912 . . . and all college homecomings are built around a football game.

It is significant that our respected opponents today are the gallant Vanderbilt University Commodores, because Kentucky and Vanderbilt have been staging football games against each other since way back in 1896, the gas-lit era and the horse and buggy days. Perhaps a few of the homecomers today were present on that momentous occasion that saw the inauguration of this ancient gridiron series, one of Dixie's oldest.

It is significant because Jackie Thompson is the guest of honor. Young Jackie Thompson, the toast of Purdue, he was when he came to Lexington in 1892 to become Kentucky's first football coach at the invitation of the late F. Paul Anderson, the former "dapper little dean" of the College of Engineering.

Although this country has weathered two wars and many cries since Young Jackie first taught rugged Kentucky boys how to play football, and although the Gay Nineties the Turbulent Twenties and the Terrible Thirties have come and gone in the interim, Kentucky has not forgotten Jackie Thompson the gentleman from Indiana.

Nor has Kentucky forgotten the gridiron heroes who have come and gone during all the years since Jackie Thompson came to Lexington with a football and a Purdue turtleneck sweater. Many of those Wildcat gladiators have passed the great divide, have crossed the final goal line into eternity, but their spirits still hover above the football field whenever the Wildcats play.

Fifty years of football at Kentucky. From Jackie Thompson to Ab Kirwan. From a thin line of spectators chasing up and down the sideline to a concrete stadium packed with cheering alumni, sudents and just plain fans. From canvas jackets to silk football pants. From the flying wedge to the T formation.








Below: Aesthetic grace is the keynote of this modern dance, as illustrated by this lovely University of Kentucky co-ed.




Right: The modern dance class goes in for the creative, judging by these three attractive girls going through a collective routine.





1893 Team

This was the third football team to represent the University of Kentucky. No doubt, several of the bully boys in this picture were on the original team of 1891 and on the team coached by Jackie Thompson in 1892. This was the second team coached by Mr. Thompson, who also was a star player on the eleven.

Among the letter men of 1893 and who are shown in the group—see if you can identify them; we couldn't—are J. I. Bryan, Norfolk, Va., now a Rear Admiral in the United States Navy; George B. Carey, Lexington contractor; Judge R. C. Stoll, Lexington, who has been chairman of the University's board of trustees for more than a quarter of a century; J. Irvine Lyle, New York, president of the Carrier Engineering Corporation.

These early Wildcats didn't do so badly as a football team. Their record follows: Kentucky 80, Georgetown 0; Kentucky 38, Transylvania 28; Kentucky 4, Centre 6; Kentucky 28, Transylvania 0; Kentucky 12, Central (Richmond) 48; Kentucky, Cincinnati Y.M.C.A. 4; Kentucky 24, Indiana 24.


The touchdown that beat Purdue that year was made by Howard Kinne, Somerset, who was killed two years later during the World War when his airplane was shot down behind the German lines in France.






