

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, August 26, 1986.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 1 p.m. (Eastern Daylight Time) on Tuesday, August 26, 1986 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Oath of Office Administered

Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 1 p.m., and the invocation was pronounced by Professor Constance P. Wilson.

Mr. McCowan welcomed the new members of the Board of Trustees and requested Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel, to administer the oath of office to the following:

Professor Raymond F. Betts, faculty representative elected to replace Professor James D. Kemp, for a term expiring June 30, 1989.

Professor David R. Driscoll, Jr., faculty representative elected to replace Professor Timothy A. Cantrell, for a term expiring June 30, 1989.

Ms. Donna G. Greenwell, who will serve as student trustee for the 1986-87 academic year.

B. Roll Call

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. Robert T. McCowan (Chairman), Professor Raymond F. Betts, Mr. William R. Black, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Professor David R. Driscoll, Jr., Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. Ronald G. Geary, Ms. Donna G. Greenwell, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Henry E. Hershey, Mr. Brereton C. Jones, Mr. R. Larry Jones, Mr. T. A. Lassetter, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. James L. Rose, Mr. Bobby Watson, and Professor Constance P. Wilson. Absent from the meeting was Mr. W. Bruce Lunsford. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Mr. James O. King, Vice President for Administration; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher, and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Raymond R. Hornback, Vice President for University Relations; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; Mr. Henry Clay Owen, Controller and Treasurer; and Dr. Paul G. Sears, Special Assistant for Academic Affairs.

Members of the various news media were also in attendance. A quorum being present, the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 1:05 p.m.

C. Minutes Approved

On motion made by Mr. Lassetter, seconded by Mrs. Hayes and passed, the Minutes of the July 29, 1986 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees were approved as written.

D. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary reported the approval of the EPSCoR grant, stating it was a significant program enhancing the University's research competition. He thanked Mr. Lassetter, chairman of a group of business, government and university leaders, who worked with the Governor and her staff in putting together the project. Mr. Lassetter expressed appreciation for Dr. Leonard Peters' significant contribution and for the support of the Governor's Office, without which, he said, the committee would not have been successful.

President Singletary also announced (a) the energy conference scheduled on September 18-19 which is expected to attract some of the top energy research people in the country, (b) the Saturday Seminar Series, preceding home football games from September 13 through November 15, sponsored by University Extension, (c) a \$1.2 million agreement between the state and the University's Transportation Research Program, and (d) the \$75,000 Merck Foundation Award from Merck, Sharp, and Dohme, which was presented to the College of Pharmacy.

E. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

With President Singletary so recommending, on motion made by Mr. Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Larry Jones and passed, the routine personnel actions in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Supplemental Personnel Actions (PR 3A-1)

Acting on the recommendation of President Singletary, Mrs. Hayes moved approval of the supplemental personnel actions in PR 3A-1. Her motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and carried. (See PR 3A-1 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Naming of University Building (PR 3A-2a)

President Singletary indicated his pleasure in recommending that the new football training facility be named the E. J. NUTTER TRAINING CENTER in honor of Mr. Ervin Nutter's significant contributions to the University of Kentucky. The motion, which was made by Mr. Brereton Jones and seconded by Mr. Black, was voted on and unanimously carried. (See PR 3A-2a at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Naming of University Building (PR 3A-2b)

President Singletary also indicated his pleasure in recommending that the new Lexington Community College building be named the RICHARD P. MOLONEY, SR. BUILDING in honor of the late Senator Moloney's many contributions to education in the Commonwealth in general and to higher education in particular. Professor Wilson so moved. The motion was seconded by Ms. Greenwell and unanimously carried. (See PR 3A-2b at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Proposed Amendment to the Governing Regulations (PR 3B)

Mr. Lassetter moved, and Mr. Larry Jones seconded, that the proposed amendment to the Governing Regulations in PR 3B which was received by the Board of Trustees at its June 1986 meeting be approved. The motion carried unanimously. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Approval of Degree Candidates--Lexington Campus and Medical Center (PR 3C)

Mr. Rose moved that the list of candidates for degrees in the Lexington Campus and Medical Center sectors as recommended in PR 3C be approved. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and carried. (See PR 3C at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Candidates for Degrees--Community College System (PR 4A)

Mr. Black moved that the degrees and certificates specified in PR 4A be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees or certificates have been satisfactorily completed. The motion, which was seconded by Mr. Clay, was voted on and carried. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Memorandum of Understanding Between the University and Community Improvement Foundation, Inc., Madisonville, Kentucky (PR 4B)

Mr. Ramsey moved that the President be authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between the Community Improvement Foundation, Inc., of Madisonville, Kentucky, concerning the acceptance of a gift of \$500,000 from the Foundation to be used to defray, in part, the cost of designing and constructing an academic/auditorium building at Madisonville Community College. The motion was seconded by Mr. Black and carried without dissent. (See PR 4B at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Resolution Relative to the Activation of the Owensboro Community College (PR 4C)

With President Singletary so recommending, Mr. Clay moved adoption of the following Resolution relative to the activation of the Owensboro Community College entitled:

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY ACCEPTING FROM THE CITY OF OWENSBORO AND COUNTY OF DAVIESS, CERTAIN LAND SITUATED IN DAVIESS COUNTY, KENTUCKY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY OWENSBORO COMMUNITY COLLEGE; FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE EMPLOYMENT OF AN ARCHITECT AND DEVELOPMENT OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW FACILITIES FOR OWENSBORO COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Mr. Clay's motion was seconded by Mr. Watson and unanimously carried. (See PR 4C at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Patent Assignment (PR 5A)

On motion made by Mr. Farmer, seconded by Mr. Larry Jones and carried, the routine patent assignment in PR 5A was approved. (See PR 5A at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Board Appointments, McDowell Cancer Network (PR 6A)

President Singletary recommended that Ms. Martha Broadbent, Dr. John Cronin, Mr. Billy Joe Hall, Ms. Cornelia Cooper, and Judge Rebecca Overstreet be reappointed as non-faculty members, and that Dr. Wimberly C. Royster and Dr. Philip DeSimone be reappointed as faculty members of the Board of Directors of the McDowell Network for terms to expire on September 30, 1988, and that Mr. David Weil and Mr. Albert Dix be appointed to fill vacancies in terms expiring on September 30, 1987. The motion, which was made by Ms. Greenwell and seconded by Mr. Rose, was voted on and carried. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

P. FUND Board of Directors Appointment (PR 6B)

On motion made by Mr. Brereton Jones, seconded by Mr. Farmer and passed, approval was given to the appointment of Mr. Arch G. Mainous, Jr. as a member of the Board of THE FUND for the Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center beginning July 1, 1986 and ending June 30, 1987. (See PR 6B at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Status Report on Open Meetings Suit

At President Singletary's request, Mr. Darsie reported that the Fayette Circuit Court has ruled that the Presidential Search Committee is not required by state law to hold its meetings in public. He further reported that the Lexington Herald-Leader has appealed the ruling.

R. Information Items

President Singletary gave the Board an update of several activities on campus including the search for directors of the Maxwell H. Gluck Equine Research Center, Robotics Center and Center for Computational Sciences. He also gave an update on capital construction projects that are underway and planned.

S. Report of Leases (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the Committee met on the morning of August 26 and reviewed the six agenda items to be presented for action. He then moved that the report of leases in FCR 1 be accepted. The motion, which was seconded by Mr. Farmer, carried. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Lease of St. Agnes House (FCR 2)

On motion made by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Griffin and carried, authorization was given for the Vice Chancellor for Administration of the Lexington Campus to renew the lease of St. Agnes House as recommended in FCR 2. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

U. Lease of Hospital Hospitality House (FCR 3)

Noting that FCR 3 was a similar lease, Mr. Clay moved that the Vice Chancellor for Administration of the Lexington Campus be authorized to renew the lease with Hospital Hospitality House of Lexington, Inc. as recommended in FCR 3. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rose and carried without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

V. Disposal of Personal Property (FCR 4)

On motion made by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Ramsey and carried, the Board approved the disposition of obsolete and surplus equipment as recommended in FCR 4. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. Authorization for Incineration of Paid Bonds and Coupons (FCR 5)

On motion made by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Larry Jones and carried, authorization was given for incineration of paid bonds and coupons as recommended in FCR 5. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

X. FCR 6 was Withdrawn

Y. Resolution Ratifying, Confirming and Approving the Action of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky (I) Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of \$21,000,000 of University of Kentucky Hospital Revenue Bonds, Series A, and (II) Modifying the Series Resolution of the Board Adopted on June 25, 1986, Authorizing the Issuance of Series A Hospital Revenue Bonds to Reflect the Correct Principal Maturities and Related Clarifying Text (FCR 7)

Trustee Clay moved and Trustee Lassetter seconded that the action of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky (i) authorizing the issuance and sale of \$21,000,000 of University of Kentucky Hospital Revenue Bonds, Series A, and (ii) modifying the Series Resolution of the Board adopted on June 25, 1986, authorizing the issuance of Series A Hospital Revenue Bonds to reflect the correct principal maturities and related clarifying text, is hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

After consideration, a yea and nay vote was taken on the motion to adopt said Resolution which resulted as follows:

The Chairman declared that the motion had carried and the Resolution was adopted. (See FCR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

Z. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Geary, Chairman of the Investment Committee, recommended and moved that the report of changes made in investments for the three months ended June 30, 1986 be accepted. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hershey and carried. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

AA. Presidential Search Committee Status Report and Portrait Committee Named

Mr. McCowan gave an update on the activities of the Presidential Search Committee.

After noting that portraits of former presidents of the University were hanging in the Board Room in the Administration Building, Mr. McCowan recommended that the Board authorize and commission an artist to paint a portrait of President Singletary. On motion made by Professor Betts, seconded by Professor Wilson and unanimously carried, it was so ordered. Mr. McCowan named the following Trustees to serve on a portrait committee: Professor Raymond F. Betts (Chairman), Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Brereton C. Jones, and Mr. Tracy Farmer.

BB. Kentucky Health Care Access Foundation, Inc. Update

Mr. Brereton Jones reminded the Board that the Health Care Access Committee was created in May 1983 to work on the indigent care problem at the Chandler Medical Center. The Committee functioned over the next one and one-half years and created the Kentucky Health Care Access Foundation. Mr. Jones reported on the success of the Foundation saying that it has helped provide care to more than 13,000 people at no cost to the taxpayers of the Commonwealth. He also reported that almost 2,300 doctors across the state and 97 of the state's 105 hospitals are participating in the program. He stated that the Foundation does, however, need funds and that it has scheduled a fund-raising event on October 11. Items of general interest will be auctioned, and Mr. Jones requested that each member of the Board donate tickets for one football game and one basketball game for this event. Mr. McCowan thanked Mr. Jones and commended him for his work on this important program.

NAMING OF UNIVERSITY BUILDING

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the name "E. J. Nutter Training Center" for the new football training facility upon recommendation of the Committee for Naming University Buildings.

Background: Mr. Ervin J. Nutter, a UK engineering graduate in the class of 1943, has pledged \$1,000,000 as a challenge gift for the football training facility--the largest single private pledge to this project. (Half the funds for the \$5,725,000 will come from private funds and half from Athletic Association monies.) Mr. Nutter is a resident Xenia, Ohio, and a prominent businessman. He is well known to UK alumni as a two-term president of the UK National Alumni Association from 1966 to 1968. While his pledge for the football project will be his largest grant to his alma mater to date, it will be one of several substantial monetary contributions he has made to the University. His contribution to this project has comprised the base of a successful private fund-raising effort.

In view of Mr. Nutter's donation and other services to the University of Kentucky, and in accordance with University Policy, the Committee on Naming University Buildings has made its recommendation to the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus who recommends to the President and the Board of Trustees that the football training facility be named the E. J. NUTTER TRAINING CENTER.

NAMING OF UNIVERSITY BUILDING

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the name "Richard P. Moloney, Sr. Building" for the new Lexington Community College building upon recommendation of the Committee for Naming University Buildings.

Background: Richard P. Moloney, Sr. served in public office, appointive and elective, for more than half of his 61 years.

Nearly 20 of those years were spent in the Kentucky General Assembly: three terms in the Senate beginning in 1944 and two terms in the House of Representatives beginning in 1960. Senator Moloney had been re-elected to begin a third term in the House in 1964 but died before taking office.

His contributions to the Kentucky General Assembly were not only significant to the legislature as an institution, but had tremendous impact on all of state government. His interest in improving Kentucky's mental health system resulted in the complete re-direction of the Kentucky mental health laws to assure treatment of our mentally ill by qualified professionals in facilities suitable for that purpose.

Senator Moloney's commitment to education produced similar results. As a member of the Senate he sponsored and guided to passage the minimum foundation legislation thereby establishing, for the first time, a standard which the state would meet in providing a statewide elementary and secondary school system. In addition to his interest in elementary and secondary education, Richard Moloney's concern for education extended to higher education. He sponsored legislation which removed unrealistic salary limitations on faculty and staff at the institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth. He secured passage of legislation which removed employees of the institutions of higher education from control by the state personnel office and his continuing support of the University of Kentucky specifically resulted in significant increases in appropriations to the University, not only for new facilities, but also for operating funds and faculty and staff salaries.

The Committee on Naming University Buildings has made its recommendation to the Chancellor of the Community College System who recommends to the President and the Board of Trustees that the new Lexington Community College building authorized by the 1986 General Assembly be named the "Richard P. Moloney, Sr. Building".

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following amendment to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky, which was received by the Board of Trustees for preliminary consideration at its June 1986 meeting, be approved:

Amendment -- Change Part X.C.5.a, third paragraph, to read:

5. Leaves of Absence

a. Sabbatical Leave

(Third paragraph follows; underlined portion is new.)

After six years of continuous eligible service, an individual may apply for one year's leave (academic year for appointees on academic year, ten-month, or eleven-month assignments) at one-half salary or six months' leave (academic semester for appointees on academic year, ten-month, or eleven-month assignments) at full salary. After three years of continuous eligible service, an appointee may apply for six months' leave (academic semester for appointees on academic year, ten-month, or eleven-month assignments) at one-half salary. Normally "continuous service" is interrupted by a sabbatical leave; that is, no service prior to a sabbatical leave may be credited toward eligibility for future sabbatical leave. However, in the event that it becomes necessary for an individual to postpone a sabbatical leave at the request of and/or for the benefit of the University or one of its educational units, the period of postponement shall be counted as part of the six years of service necessary for the individual to again become eligible for sabbatical leave. The request for and/or agreement that the sabbatical leave be postponed must be made in writing by the dean or director of the individual's college and be approved by the appropriate chancellor. The request or agreement must specify the period of postponement and the reason for it. In no case shall cumulative sabbatical leave be granted for a single period longer than one full year at full salary. Leaves of absence without pay are not normally credited toward eligibility for sabbatical leave. However, exception may be made when the leave enhances the value of the individual to the University, e.g., a leave to accept a fellowship or grant, service for professional organizations, and so forth. In no case shall the leave of absence without pay be considered as an interruption of continuous service.

Background: The recommendation of this change in the Governing Regulations was approved by the University Senate at its meeting on April 28, 1986.

As the Governing Regulations now read, a faculty member is eligible for sabbatical leave after six years of continuous service. A sabbatical leave breaks the continuous service and the six-year clock begins to run again only at the conclusion of the sabbatical leave. Occasionally, however, a department or division chairman and/or a dean or director of a college will request a faculty member who is eligible to apply for a sabbatical leave to postpone it for a year or more. This may occur, for example, if too many faculty in a department or division become eligible in the same year and the chairman believes that the instructional program will suffer if all of the eligible faculty take leave at once. Likewise, a department or division chairman or a dean or director of a college may be asked to postpone or consider postponing sabbatical leave because it would be in the best interest of the department or college that he or she finish out an administrative term. In such situations the University Senate recommends that the faculty member not be penalized for postponing sabbatical leave by forfeiting the year(s) postponed toward the continuous service necessary to be eligible for a later sabbatical leave. The University Senate is not proposing that such years count when the faculty member postpones sabbatical leave for his or her own convenience. The University Senate proposes the change as being fair both to the faculty and the University.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY ACCEPTING FROM THE CITY OF OWENSBORO AND COUNTY OF DAVIESS, CERTAIN LAND SITUATED IN DAVIESS COUNTY, KENTUCKY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY OWENSBORO COMMUNITY COLLEGE; FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE EMPLOYMENT OF AN ARCHITECT AND DEVELOPMENT OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW FACILITIES FOR OWENSBORO COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised Statute 164.580, (enacted 1962, revised effective June 16, 1966), established the University of Kentucky Community College System, and,

WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised Statute 164.591, as revised, effective July 15, 1986, provides that a community college shall be maintained at Owensboro, Kentucky, and,

WHEREAS, the City of Owensboro and County of Daviess have agreed to purchase a certain tract of land comprising approximately 100 acres known as part of the Field property, in Daviess County, Kentucky, to be used as the site of the Owensboro Community College, and cause said land to become available by deed to the Commonwealth of Kentucky, for the use and benefit of the University of Kentucky, without cost to the Commonwealth or the University, and,

WHEREAS, the University of Kentucky, having determined that the aforementioned tract of land meets its requirements for a community college site, has agreed to accept, by and through the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the deed to the Owensboro Community College site, from the City of Owensboro and County of Daviess, provided certain hereinafter enumerated conditions are met, and,

WHEREAS, the University of Kentucky desires to cause the appointment of an architect for the preparation of plans and specifications for the construction of the new facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky:

1. That the President of the University be authorized to accept from the City of Owensboro and County of Daviess, title to a certain tract of land in Daviess County, Kentucky, consisting of approximately 100 acres and described on the attached sketch, to be used as the site of the Owensboro Community College, provided the following conditions are met:


- (a) That the City of Owensboro and County of Daviess make available to the University a property abstract indicating that a General Warranty deed from the City of Owensboro and County of Daviess, to the Commonwealth of Kentucky, for the use and benefit of the University of Kentucky, will vest the Commonwealth with a free, clear and unencumbered fee simple title.
- (b) That the Community College site be annexed to, and made a part of, the City of Owensboro, Kentucky.

2. That the administration is hereby authorized to cause the appointment of an architect for the preparation of plans and specifications for the construction of new facilities.

3. That the Board of Trustees express its thanks and appreciation to the City of Owensboro, the County of Daviess, and the Owensboro Citizens Committee on Higher Education, for their significant contribution to the educational progress of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

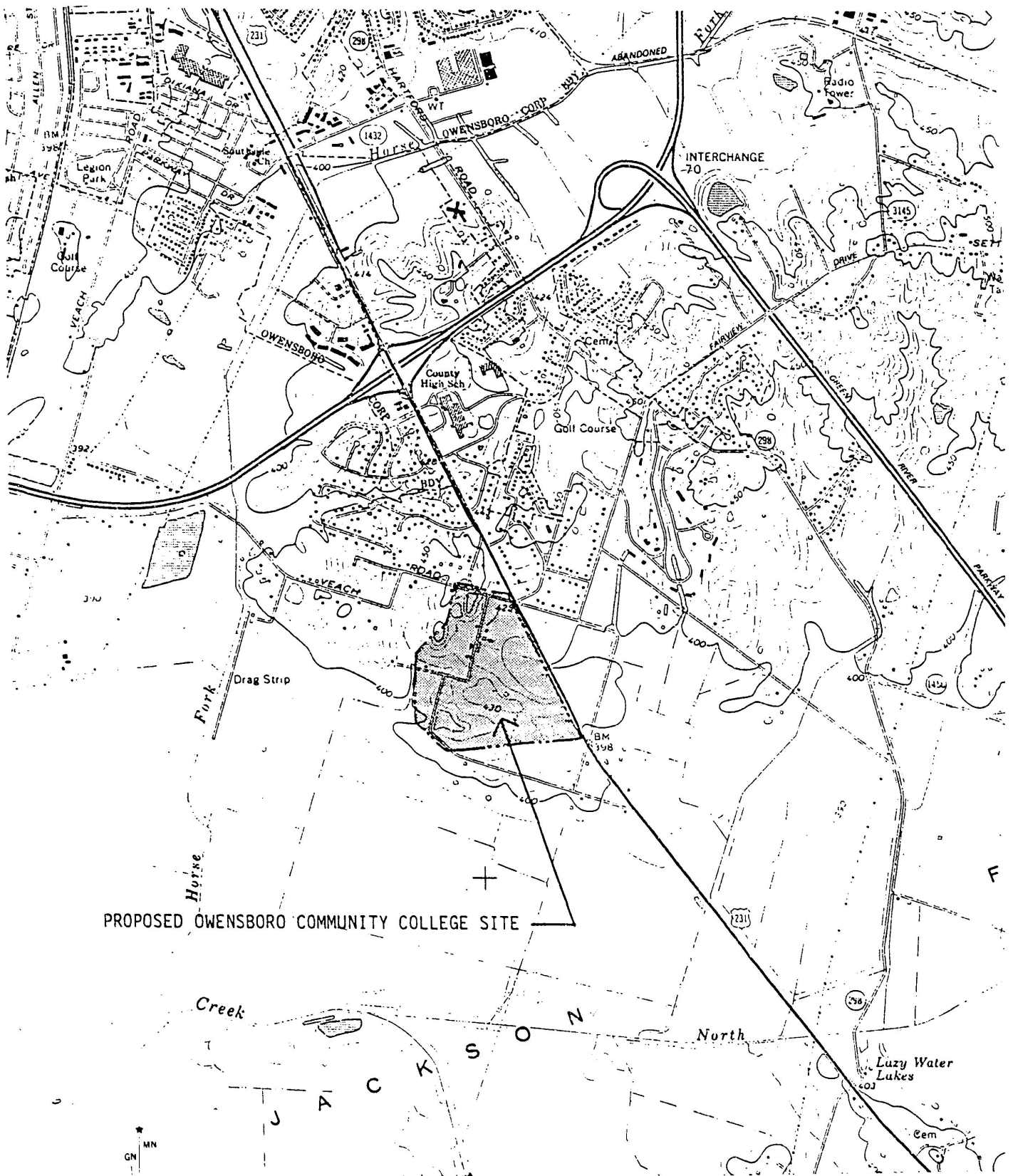

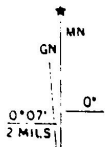

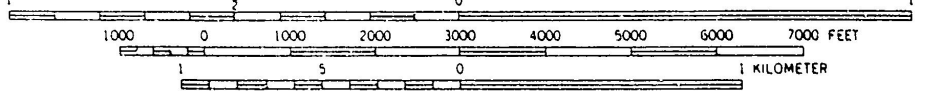


PROPOSED OWENSBORO COMMUNITY COLLEGE SITE

LEASE

THIS LEASE made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 1986, by and between the UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY, hereinafter sometimes referred to as University, first party, lessor and the HOSPITAL HOSPITALITY HOUSE OF LEXINGTON, INC., hereinafter sometimes referred to as H.H.H., second party, lessee:

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, first party now owns as a part of the campus of the University certain property designated as 342 South Limestone Street, in Fayette County, Kentucky, known as Hamilton House, and

WHEREAS, second party desires to lease said property and building thereon for use as an accommodation for H.H.H. activities,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the promises hereinafter made, first party agrees to lease the above described property together with all improvements thereon to second party for a term of five (5) years beginning on the first day of September, 1986, and terminating on the last day of August, 1991, unless there is a breach in the conditions contained herein, or unless the lessee gives to the lessor a sixty-day written notice of its intention to vacate the property and surrender the lease.

THE PARTIES HERETO bind themselves to the following terms and conditions and agree to perform the same.

1) The lessee shall pay to the lessor as money rental for said premises the sum of one dollar (\$1.00), per year in advance, on the first day of September of each year throughout the term of this lease, or any renewal of this lease.

2) The premises shall at all times be under the control of the lessor, with the right to require lessee to make repairs and alterations or additions which the lessor deems necessary to maintain the premises.

3) Lessee shall at its own expense repair and maintain the demised premises as outlined in Appendix "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Lessee may at its own expense make internal alternations or improvements to the demised premised, provided written permission of lessor is first obtained. All such repairs, maintenance, alterations or improvements must conform to applicable building codes, fire safety codes, etc.

4) Lessee shall be responsible for payment to the lessor of charges for electricity, water, and heat. Said charges shall be assessed against the lessee based upon meter readings. Lessee shall be responsible for any expenses associated with telephone service.

5) Lessee may sublet a room or rooms of the demised premises to no more than twenty persons on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis, and lessee may sublet a room or rooms to groups for meetings or other functions.

6) Lessee shall maintain in force at all times liability insurance covering the demised premises of the "owners, landlords, and tenants" designation in amounts no less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for each person, three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) for annual aggregate bodily injury and fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for property damage, with the University of Kentucky named as an additional insured.

7) Lessee shall be responsible for payment to the lessor of a prorated charge for fire and extended coverage insurance on the demised premises.

8) Lessor shall allow members and guests of the Hospital Hospitality House of Lexington, Inc. temporary passes for parking in the "C" parking lot located behind the Coliseum and in the "B" parking lot located on Harrison Street. Lessor does not guarantee that spaces in said lots will be available.

9) It is contemplated that no taxes will be payable on the leased property, but in the event of a change in the law or

otherwise, if the property is subject to taxation of any kind, sewer rentals or charges or special or improvement assessments or levies, then the lessee shall reimburse the lessor for such taxes or charges.

10) At all times during the term of this lease, the building and surrounding grounds are to be kept in a presentable condition. The lessee is not to remove or permit to be removed any fixtures or equipment furnished by the lessor. The lessee is not to commit or allow waste or the maintenance of a nuisance and can terminate this lease only as specified by the terms of this lease, unless the lessor elects to treat an act of the lessee as a termination. Upon the expiration or termination of this lease, the property and any fixtures or equipment furnished by lessor is to be surrendered to the lessor in as good condition as when the lessee entered into possession, reasonable wear, tear and normal decadence excepted.

11) The execution of this instrument has been approved by proper resolutions adopted by the governing bodies of the parties hereto and signed by the persons authorized in said resolutions to execute the same and copies of said resolutions are attached hereto.
