Replacement: UK seeking to fill administration seat left vacant by retirement of senior veep Jack Blanton

More women and minorities have applied to replace Jack More women and minorities have applied to replace Jack Blanton, the senior vice president of administration, than most administrators had expected.

"I'm rather pleased. After just flipping through some of the applications, it looks like more women and minorities applied than 1 had initially expected." said Eyther Lach, the assistant dean for administration for the College of Medicine and a member of the Commission on Women.

Lach, who has served in a consulting role for the search, Said she contacted agencies and organizations that are involved with underrepresented groups to help promote the search. Blanton, who has held the job since July 2001, said he was not interested in applying for the job again.
"I'm too old!" Blanton, 67, said jokingly "No, I'm ready to retire, but I've enjoyed the job enormously."
Blanton also held positions as vice chancellor for administration from 1982-2001, vice president for business affairs and university treasurer from 1975-1982, and taught introduction to business management for 18 years.

Bush's budget proposes tax cuts

Bush's budget proposes tax cuts

WASHINGTON —President Bush will send Congress a \$2.23 trillion spending plan Monday featuring new tax cuts to boost the economy, a conservative tilt to major social programs and record declicits for the next two years — shortfalls that Democrats blame on Bush's tax cuts. White House budget officials said Sunday the president's tax and spending blueprint, complete with dozens of agency briefings, will roll out as scheduled despite Saturday's space shuttle disaster. Bush's budget outline for the 2004 fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1. is required by law to be sent to Congress the first Monday in February The numbers and spending priorities undoubtedly will change somewhat over the next several amonts as Congress acts on his request. The Columbia tragedy certainly will prompt added scrutiny to the president's spending proposal for NASA, which has come under heavy criticism from Congress in recent years because of cost overruns for the orbiting space station and other programs.

Vehicle sales may decline with war

Vehicle sales may decline with war SAN FRANCISCO —This year's U.S. vehicle sales likely will decline at least 1.8 percent if the nation goes to war with Iraq, but should remain strong by historical standards, the National Automobile Dealers Association predicted Sunday. NADA chief economist Paul Taylor, speaking at the organization's 86th annual convention, projected new car and light truck sales of 16.5 million in 2003, down from 16.8 million last year, the fourth-best tally on record. If the U.S. goes to war with Iraq, Taylor says total volume likely will decline by another 200,000 vehicles as the condict chills Americans' spending. His predictions are in line with most industry forecasts, which range from 15.9 million to some 17 million. Some of the 25.000 dealers and industry observers here said they've been encouraged by recent economic indica-

and industry observers here said they we been encouraged by recent economic indica-tors, such as Friday's news that Americans boosted their spending in December by the largest amount in five months.

WASHINGTON — President Bush is entering one of the most difficult weeks of his presidency leading the nation in mourning over the space shuttle while bracing Ameri-cans for war and defending a budget proposal that promises

the most difficult weeks of his presidency, leading the nation in mourning over the space shuttle while bracing Americans for war and defending a budget proposal that promises record deficits.

He spoke with the leaders of Pakistan, Spain and India Sunday, juggling condolence calls with efforts to build support for military action against fraq.

The president arranged to meet Monday with NASA chief Sean O'Keefe, before O'Keefe briefed lawmakers.

Bush and his wife, Laura, are to fly to Johnson Space Center on Tuesday for a NASA memorial service for the seven astronauts killed Saturday.

The president was releasing a spending plan Monday for the budget year beginning Oct. 1 that offers a string of deficits for five years, with cuts in some popular programs and growth in otherstation official speaking Sunday night on Asenica admonymity said the new budget would propen increasing NASA's budget from \$15\$ billion this year to pearly \$15.5\$ billion next year. The official did not know what the change for the space shutle program would be.

Bush planned to emphasize in a Monday afternoon event his request for \$8 billion over a decade to quickly make available vaccines and treatments against bioweapons such as anthrax and plague.

Administration and congressional sources said Bush's plan envisions record deficits of \$307 billion this year and \$304 billion in 2004. The \$2.25 budget proposal does not take into account the tens of billions of dollars war would cost.

The situation in Iraq also takes center stage this week. Bush was to meet Wednesday with the prime minister. Poland, the same day Secretary of State Colin Powell goes before the UK. Security Council to present purported evidence of prohibited Iraqi weapons programs.

A session scheduled for Tuesday with the king of Barhain was postponed indefinitely by Bush's trip to Housen, while the nation grieved.

White House spokesman Art Fleischer said Bush's determination to disarm or confront Iraq would not be derailed.



dent for finance and administration, which one administrator said will reflect the job's responsibilities.

"This person is the chief financial officer and the chief

financial officer and the chief daministrator for non-acade administrator for non-acade and affairs," said Henry Clay Owen, the university's trea-surer and controller and the chairman of the advisory committee for the position. Last fall, the search for a provost was criticized as not being inclusive enough, with many on the advisory com-mittee announcing their sup-port for Mike Nietzel, the act-

ing provost, before the search was over Nietzel was later appointed to the position permanently.

With such criticisms of UK administration searches, administrators have worked to attract more women and minority applicants during this search.

Owen said the position has been advertised in major academic journals. The ads said the deadline for applications was Jan. 30, though owen said late applications would still be accepted.

"We'll probably have about 75 applications by the end," he said.

Jeff Dembo, the chairman of the University Senate, said he wants diverse candidates.

"It's an administrative position, not an academic position, not an academic position ilike the provost. But we still have concerns abut

diversity, especially in attracting qualified women and minority candidates," Dembo said.

The advisory committee will make its recommendations to President Lee Todd, who will make the final decision. Owen said they hope to have the position filled as soon as possible.

He said the committee has outlined qualities for a new administrator, such as an in-depth knowledge of finance and administrator in an executive position, preferably at a college or university.

He said that the new administrator will have a lot to live up to after Blanton's years at UK.

"Blanton's known and respected nationally for his work," Owen said. "He's going to be hard to replace."



After the explosion of the space shuttle Challenger in 1986, the type of research NASA funded changed before Challenger, the organization had an academic atmosphere, Huang said, but afterward, the it encouraged research that had a practical purpose. Huang said he expects more changes in the aftermath of Columbia.

"I guess they'll give another whip to this organization and make it more focused," he said.

Where did it go?: New software angers directors by taking out original material in movies

Los Angeles — Last June, Utah software developer Breck Rice met with movie directors to pitch new software for letting consumers digitally alter Hollywood hits. It could insert product placements into movies, make a New York skyline resemble Tokyo and even drape a modest negligee over Kate Winslet during her nude scene in Ttanic.

The program, called "MovieMask," was designed in large part to make movies more family friendly, skipping violent or sexual content and toning down language.

To demonstrate, Rice showed the directors a demo tape. The swords in a fight in Rob Reiner's The Princess Bride became light sabers. Jack Nicholson's lips in A Few Good Men were altered and an added voiceover substituted "you funny people" for a rant using an offensive term. The directors were furious.

"It was heated. The directors did feel threatened." said Warren Adler, who attended the meeting and is associate national director of the Directors Guild of America.

That gathering solidified the battle lines between Hollywood and a growing business dedicated to santitzing films and television programs.



"That's our Achilles heel," UK coach Bernadette Mattox sald of her team's rebounding.

The Cats made 17-of-48 field goal attempts, giving up 18 offensive rebounds.
"We gave up too many offensive rebounds." Mattox sald. "It goes back to us making shots that we make in practice, and we did not make those shots today." A lack in offense may have cost UK the game, but

its defense is what kept the game close.

South Carolina senior forward Jocelyn Penn was the No. 2 shooter in the country coming into the game on Sunday. She was averaging 26 points a game and eight rebounds. The Cats were able to hold Penn to only six points and two rebounds.

Overall, the Gamecocks were held to 26-percent field goal shooting and UK pulled down 26 defensive rebounds.

While the defense stepped it up, the Cats were not able to get over the offensive hump. UK turned the ball over 23 times and grabbed only 10 offensive rebounds.

"To stop turning the ball over and getting more shots in, I think that is going to get us over the hump," UK senior guard Rita Adams said.
"Then we are going to come even more together as a team and, start winning more games."

WEDNESDAY

Faced with a possible \$28 million cut in state funding, UK administrators froze hirring, restricted travel and overtime and — among other ways to reduce costs — encouraged employees to turn down the heat in their offices, the Kernel

reported.
With cuts as serious as these, administrators said they will increase tuition and may restrict

enrollment. State budget estimates show a \$384 million budget shortfall for the fiscal year 2004. The Kentucky Constitution requires the General Assembly to produce a balanced budget. State legislators are asking universities to cinch their purse strings in hopes of sparing primary and secondary education from severe cuts.

THURSDAY

Leaders of Kentucky's public universities with the state's House budget subcommittee on education to discuss the measures they would have to take if a 9 percent cut in higher education funding is approved by the legislature, the Kernel reported.

Kernel reported.

Cutting higher education funding will not only hamper the ability of universities to conduct research and provide quality teaching, but will threaten the long-term economic and social well-being of all Kentuckians, they said.

UK President Lee Todd said if the cuts are passed UK would have to eliminate 125 faculty positions and more than 500 staff positions.

Richard Reid, a British-born follower of Osama bin Laden, as sentenced to life in prison for trying to blow up a trans-Adantic flight with explosives stuffed in his shoes. A defiant Reid, who pleaded guilty in October to all charges stemming from his failed attempt in December 2001, told Chief U.S. District Judge William Young that he was a soldier "at war" with the United States because it sponsored the "rape and torture" of Muslims.

SUNDAY

German Chancellor Gerhard Schroder's So-cial Democratic Party took a hit in elections. Its main opposition parties received record totals in two state elections, exit polls showed.

The conservative Christian Democrats ap-peared to have won 48 percent of the vote in Low-er Saxony, Schroder's home state. The Social De-mocrats got only 34 percent, down from 48 per-cent last time.

This was the first electoral test for the Social Democrats since they won the national election in September. The vote shows voters' unhappi-ness with Schroder's economic performance, es-pecially his failure to stem a rise in unemploy-ment levels to the highest in a decade.

Anyone walking along Limestone has undoubtedly noticed the LexTran buses dropping off and picking up students living at the Greg Page Apartments. In fact, one recent Friday afternoon, five of these buses passed by heading toward Greg Page in a one-hour period. It certainly seems that students living at Greg Page never have to wait more than 10 or 15 minutes to be picked up.

But for those students living at University Compage there is an enrighly different story. Between

mons, there is an entirely different story. Between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., one bus running a reg-ular LexTran route picks up students on campus be-tween 50 and 55 minutes past every hour, right after classes let out three days per week. Commons students are often left on campus for an extra hour while waiting on the next bus to arrive.

There is an important distinction here. The campus for an important distinction here.

pus buses run directly between the Greg Page and Shawneetown apartments and back. The University Commons bus, though, is on the Leestown Road route, and is not provided to students as a shuttle. This was not an issue until last fall, when UK was forced to place students at University Commons due

The Greg Page apartments hold 480 students at maximum capacity. University Commons is current-

Anyone walking along Limestone has undoubted- ly at capacity with 674 students. Why should more buses be provided to Greg Page students when there

are a significantly larger number of students living at University Commons?

According to Don Thornton, director of parking and transportation services, the shuttle services are provided only to students who pay for parking permits, since these permits are the means of paying LexTran for the services provided. He also said a shuttle to the Commons would result in an enormous expense that would ultimately come back to the students. It is unlikely that students would support such

a charge.
So it seems that if students living at University Commons want a more frequent bus service, they will need to contact LexTran directly. The executive director, Steve Rowland, can order counts of riders in order to assess whether there is a need for a second bus on the route. If there is significant student inter-

sest, Thornton can arrange a meeting.

Things cannot change on their own. If Commons students want this change, it is necessary for them to initiate the discussion themselves. Hopefully, with student involvement, a change can occur, and dents will no longer be left to wait for an extra hour for a ride home.

Funding cut compromises progress

Greetings from Kentucky, where education pays, and I'm still waiting for my check.

Indeed, despite the state's pledge to higher education, it appears more funding cuts are in the works for our university. If legislatures decide to cut funding 9 percent across the board, it will set back our state's ambitious post-secondary education program by several years.

The numbers only tell half the story. In the past two years, Todd has made increasing enrollment and expansion of statefunded education programs the centerpiece of his administration. As a result, we have record enrollment, as well as the staffing and housing problems that accompany it. So with record-sized classes, an already over-burdened educational infrastructure and departments competing for sparse resources. UK is about to see a large part of its funding evaporate.

This is a hard reality for the staff, facul-

ty and administration. They are watching their well-intentioned plans for making UK a top-rate center of learning become subject to the whims of a partisan state legislature. It's an even harder reality for the students. Lured by the promise of "America's Next Great University." Students from all over the state and abroad have been drawn to UK. 
