Webb graduated from UK with a bachelor's degree in marketing last month. The self-taught guitarist also plays the piano, and he's been playing around campus since August 2005 with a constantly evolving roster of talent to back him up. "Lexington is a great environment with

great emotion," Webb said. "It is easy to just sit back and write songs. I have really developed myself here."

Webb covers many popular songs and adds his own twists at every bar and venue he plays in Lexington. He also writes his own material. His first song, "Sara," was recorded in his parent's basement. The single made it to the top of countdowns on local radio stations and was in regular rotation at CD 106.3 FM.

Webb's unique sound employs reliable lyrics; his music has been compared to O.A.R., Jack Johnson, and Dave Matthews.

Voted Best UK Athlete, Jodie Meeks has left quite an impression on us. This 6-foot-5 guard from Norcross, Ga., is usually the first off the bench as well as the first on our list.

So what is it about Meeks that has UK fans cheering?

The Herald Leader claims that his "hot hand gives UK edge." It is not indeed. Meeks had a 25 free throw streak and a record of making 46 of his last 49 free throw attempts. This includes the two winning free throw shots against Indiana.

Averaging 8.5 points a

game, Meeks scored 273 points in the 2006-07 season making him the fourth highest scorer on the team. Totalling 686, he averaged 21.4 minutes of playing time per game; pretty impressive for a freshman guard.

His career highs include 18 points against Louisville, 11 field goal attempts against Mississippi Valley State, 5 assists against College of Charleston and 6 steals against Mississippi State.

What really turned UK fans onto Meeks, however, would undoubtedly be the win against Louisville, or what is commonly called "The Jodie Meeks Game." He was the key player

in the win and helped put UK in the lead many times throughout the game. In an interview after the game, Coach Dave Hobbs said that Meeks' "scorer's mentality" was what set him apart from the rest of his teammates.

His performance in the game made him a "bundle of promise" for UK athletics.

In addition to being voted the Best UK Athlete, Meeks has received other numerous honors. In high school he was named Player of the Year by the Atlanta-Journal Constitution, the Atlanta Tipoff Club



and the Gwinnett Daily Post. So far in his college career, he was named Freshman All-American by Collegeinsider.com.

Jodie Meeks is the future of UK basketball. UK fans have much to look forward to during the next three years. He's just getting started.

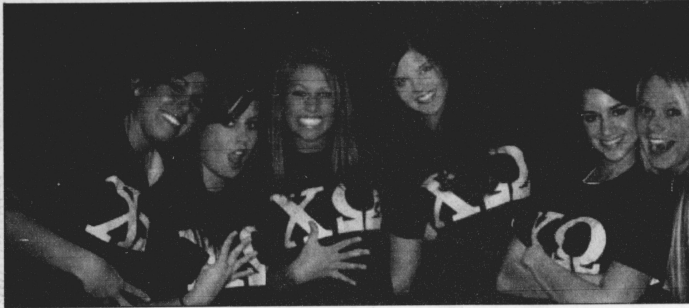

"I am excited for Matthew

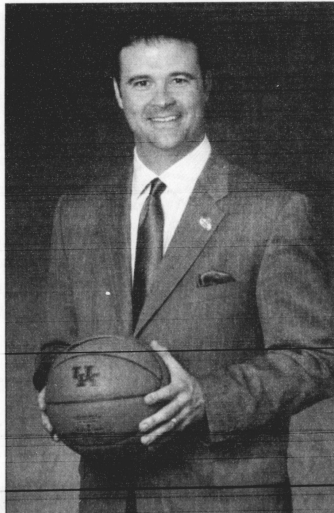

"I am extremely honored to be the coach at Kentucky," Mitchell said during the press conference announcing his hiring. "I'm just excited to have the opportunity to lead the program and continue building a championship-caliber team."

With the growing program and a new coach that knows how UK Hoops works, it is no surprise that UK students chose women's basketball as one of their favorite sports. The 2007-08 season will surely be a significant year for UK Hoops.

A favorite among many University of Kentucky basketball and football fans, Billy's Barbecue was voted the best barbecue restaurant.

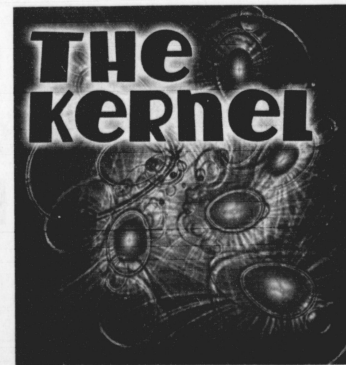

With no exaggeration, they have the largest poster collection in the state. In addition, they carry t-shirts, music DVDs and other little things but Steve assured me that their "main focus

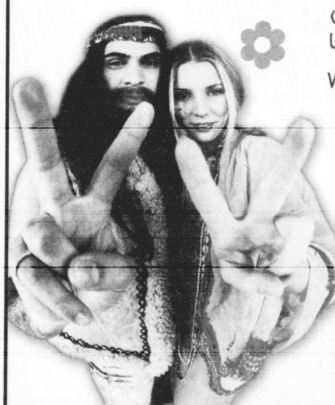

Moving into your new residence in Lexington, you will quickly realize that the community is full of history and charm as well as Southern hospitality, basketball mania and horse racing. Likewise, Lexington is rich in cultural activities and events, including an ever-growing arts scene. While Lexington offers you a number of varied options of its own, don't forget the wealth of fine arts resources at your fingertips at the University of Kentucky.

UK is home to thriving programs in art, music and theatre. It has various venues showcasing student, faculty and visiting talent including the UK Art Museum, Barnhart Gallery, Briggs Theatre, Guignol Theatre, Memorial Hall, Raddall Gallery, Singletary Center for the Arts and the Tuska Center for Contemporary Art. As a student you can take in an art exhibit, concert, opera or play for a reasonable discounted price, or many times for free.

The UK Department of Art has developed a reputation as a national leader in new approaches to the creation, interpretation, and history of art and educating artists, teachers, and future leaders in the field. Art students exhibit work at UK's Barnhart Gallery as well as various community galleries throughout the year. Student and faculty shows at the campus galleries are free and open to the public. The Department of Art also showcases advanced work by students graduating with a Masters of Fine Arts and new artists from around the globe at the Tuska Center for Contemporary Art. Possibly one of the most exciting events you can enjoy as a student at UK is the program's Open Studio. This annual event is held just before Christmas and gives students and the Lexington community an opportunity to start their own art collections by showcasing and selling works by UK's budding artists and popular artists and faculty.

The UK School of Music is one the university's

programs designated as an Area of Excellence. The school has achieved awards and national recognition for high-caliber education in opera, choral and instrumental music performance as well as for music education, composition, theory and music history. Similarly, the faculty has gained national and international prominence in their respective fields. Students, faculty and guest artists at the School of Music present around 200 concerts, recitals and public lectures each year at the Singletary Center for the Arts and other campus locations. The UK Opera, Symphony Orchestra, Wind Ensemble and Men's and Women's Choirs each perform several programs each year with significant student discounts. The UK Jazz Ensemble and most other performances are free or discounted to students.

The UK Department of Theatre presents its students with a laboratory experience, giving them opportunities to learn all facets of the shows they stage from design concepts to presentation. UK Theatre faculty have specialties that range from acting, playwriting, directing, stagecraft, scenic design, lighting design, costume technology and design to dramaturgy and theatre history. Students put on numerous productions each year, including four in the Guignol Theatre, located in the Fine Arts Building on Rose Street. The fun is not limited to only those majoring theatre - any UK student can participate in these programs by auditioning for a role or signing up to work backstage. Theatre's selections range from original works premiered at UK to popular Broadway fare.

UK is also home to two large venues that host exceptional exhibitions and acts from around the world. The UK Art Museum and the Singletary Center for the Arts, located on the corner of Rose Street and Euclid Avenue, have provided students and Kentucky citizens a popular venue to watch UK's up-and-coming talent and work by the world's premiere artists, musicians, singers, dancers and

actors.

The UK Art Museum is a world-class art museum that owns over 4,000 art treasures in various media. The museum, which is housed in the Singletary Center, displays highlights of its collection on the museum's second floor. Selections from the museum's holdings of works are displayed on a rotating schedule. Likewise, the museum hosts approximately four international art exhibitions a year for students and residents of the Commonwealth to enjoy. These international exhibitions are presented on the facility's first floor. UK students can view all these exhibitions at the museum for free.

The Singletary Center for the Arts presents numerous brilliant and varied performances in its Concert and Recital Halls throughout the year, hosting an average of 3.7 million patrons at approximately 400 events annually. The center, as part of the College of Fine Arts, presents and hosts artistic, cultural and educational events for not only the campus, but all Kentuckians. Events range from recitals and concerts starring UK students to scheduled acts for both the Singletary Center's Corner on Classics Series and Turning the Corner Series. Corner on Classics continues to present world-acclaimed artists by offering and staging concerts by renowned musicians, dancers and ensembles from every corner of the globe. Concerts from the Turning the Corner Series remain popular with students. This series responds to the musical interests of UK's students by scheduling the best artists in contemporary music today in the Singletary Center's intimate setting. Tickets to these programs have discounted rates for UK students.

One more option for entertainment ideas at UK is presented by the Student Activities Board. This organization schedules concerts, performances, movies, lectures and art exhibits of interest to students at various campus

locations. The organization also maintains Raddall Gallery in the UK Student Center where works by student, local and international artists are scheduled for display in a casual, comfortable setting. Tickets for these events are made available at low student rates or often provided to students for free.

To find out more about the hundreds of concerts, exhibitions, operas and plays to be presented in the 2006-07 season, contact the program or faculty by phone or visit them online. And don't forget to take advantage of your student rate making it possible to experience and learn about all types of arts programs or at the very least a respite from hours of studying.



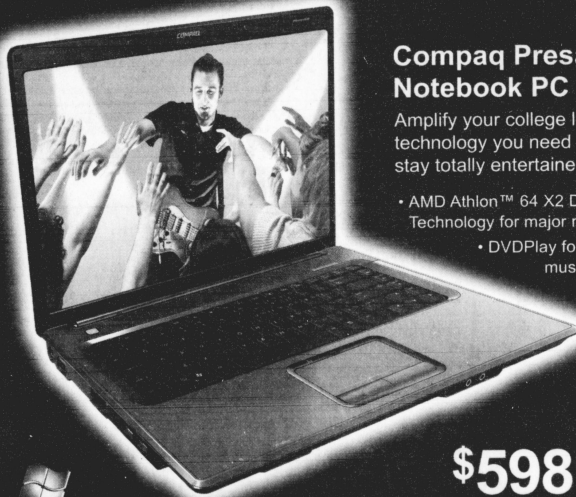

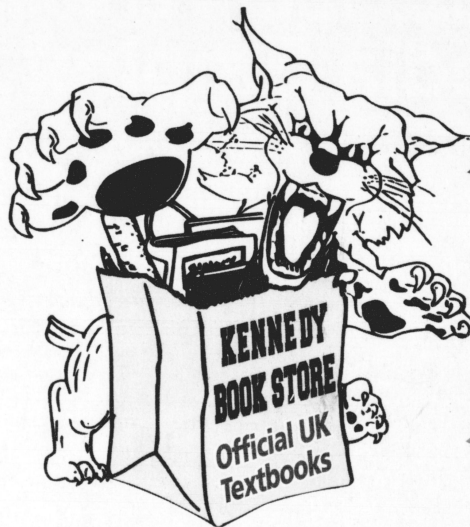
