

A. and M. College of Kentucky,
December 8, 1899

The faculty met in the President's room
in the College Building at 4pm

All present except Prof. Anderson and
Prof. Worwick.

The minutes of the previous meeting were
read corrected and approved.

Prof. White chairman of the committee
appointed to determine the conditions under
which those who ^{have} received ^{the} Bachelors degree in
one course may become candidates for the
Master's degree in an other course, reported
as follows:

Your committee desire to submit the
following recommendation: viz.

B.S. + B.A.
graduates
account to work
for M.A. + M.S.

That any student having a B.S. or B.A.
degree from this college or from any
college doing work of approximately the grade of
that done by this college may be a candidate
for either an A.M. or an M.S. degree, provided
he can produce satisfactory evidence of his
ability to do work of a post-graduate
character to a committee consisting of the
President of the College, the dean of the course
of study leading to the Master's degree desired
and the Professor under whom he proposes
to take his major study.

Prof. Rank moved to amend the report by
inserting B. Ed. The amendment was
approved.

On motion the report as amended was
then approved.

The Secretary of the Scientific faculty submitted the following: as the action of that faculty, viz:

(1) "That this faculty recommends to the general faculty that a committee shall be appointed to enquire into the status of all colleges from which this college is likely to receive graduate students and to consider upon what terms such graduate students shall be admitted to become candidates for the advanced degrees offered by this college & institution."

Pate, W.S.

(2) That Mr W.S. Pate be recommended to the general faculty as a candidate for the degree of M.S.

On motion recommendation No 1 was approved with the provision that the committee therein provided for be a standing committee

On motion recommendation No 2, was approved.

After some suggestions by Prof McKenzie relative to some modification in the Course in English,

Prof White moved that a committee of which Prof McKenzie shall be Chairman be appointed to consider and report upon the suggestions.

The Chair appointed Profs McKenzie, Neville and White as members of the Committee.

Ordered that all class room work be suspended during the days set for examinations.
