

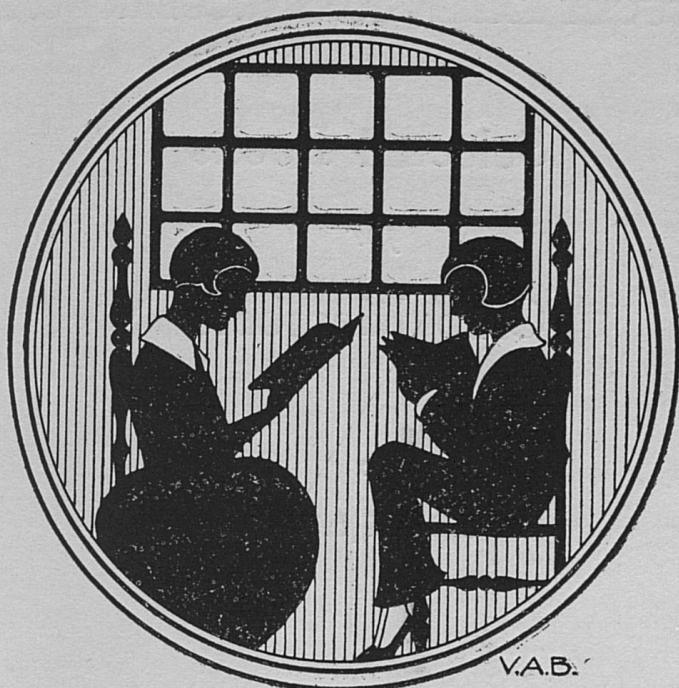

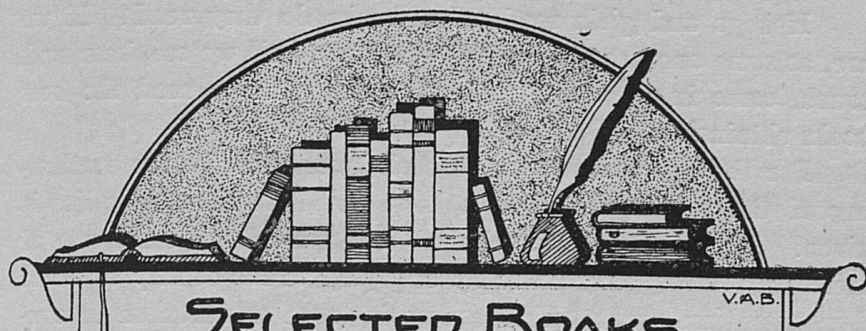

How do boys and girls spend their leisure hours? Reading? It is to be hoped that part of this time is spent in this pleasant and profitable pursuit. As a lover of books, Dr. Arnott said, "In a corner of my house I have books, the miracle of all my possessions, more wonderful than the wishing cap of the Arabian tales; for they transport me instantly, not only to all places, but to all times. By my books I can conjure up before me to a momentary existence many of the great and good men of past ages, and for my individual satisfaction they seem to act again the most renowned of their achievements; their orators declaim for me, the historians recite, the poets sing."

If boys and girls read, what books do they read? If we are, as some one has rightly said, a part of all we see, hear and touch, come into contact with, it behoves us to read the best books obtainable.

For the convenience of the book lover, and for the awakening of the reading habit in others, the following book list is given. Any club member who wishes to try for a certificate of merit on reading may do so by applying to his county or home demonstration agent. This course is to be undertaken in conjunction with some agricultural or home project. The requirements are:

To send to the county or home demonstration agent a satisfactory review of books read.

To read at least

One book of nature

One book of travel or history

One book of fiction

Ten poems

One book related to the club project of which the reader is a member.

These books are to be books that are suggested in the book list, or satisfactory ones substituted.

Upon the completion of the year's work a certificate of merit will be issued by the College of Agriculture.

TRAVELING LIBRARIES

Traveling libraries furnished by the state are available to clubs that do not have local libraries. For information regarding the use of these books, write Kentucky Library Commission, State Capitol Building, Frankfort, Kentucky.

Types of libraries available—

- (1) Collections of 50 books—for general reading and study.
- (2) Study libraries—small groups of books on special subjects for use of study clubs and individual students. These are loaned for 30 days, with the privilege of an extension of time.
- (3) Farmers' libraries—consisting of from 15 to 50 books on agricultural subjects.

Conditions of the loan—

- (1) Books to be loaned without charge.
- (2) Books to be kept in a centrally located and suitable place.
- (3) Books to be kept safely.
- (4) Books to be returned in good condition at end of six months unless extension of time is granted.
- (5) Two dollars to be paid to cover cost of transportation from Frankfort and returning.
