The Black Student Union is rooted in social change.

In 1996, a group of black students formed the group Orgena — a negro spelled backward — as a social and cultural outlet for black students.

Orgena petitioned UK administrators for a course on black history and held weeklydialogues on events and developments related to the civil-rights movement. The

group changed its name to the Black Stu-dent Union in 1988.
The students tackled the need for African-American history courses: UK's failure to recruit black athletes, students and faculty; faculty behavior toward black students, and community concerns with housing, employment and police brutality.

housing, employment and police brutality. Over the years, the BSU has provided a relaxed and challenging atmosphere for black students. "BSU is an organization that advocates the best interests of African-American stu-

dents at the University of Kentucky," said Chester Grundy, director of African-American Student Affairs.

Over the years, many students have gained invaluable experience from attending the BSU meetings.

"If first started attending the meetings this semester and I found the atmosphere to be both business oriented and friendly, said Angela Peagler, a biology junior.

Group reports rights violation in Mexico

A War is brewing in Mexico, but dissidents can leave their machine guns at home. Instead, they should arm themselves with thread, thimbles and needles.

An international independent factory-monitoring group has reported violations of a number of workers' rights at a Mexican clothing factory that produces Nike apparel.

An investigation team from the Worker Rights Consortium visited the Nike contractor's factory in Altixoo, Mexico, in early February and has reported a number of "severe ongoing violations of worker rights" including substandard pay, verbal and physical assaults on workers and corrupt unions.

Nike, including those of IK. Becauses some pitting promote IK and other institutions, many feel that universities are inadvertently condoning the working conditions.

"This is not a message we want to send to the people who make the clothing bearing our universities' logos," said the delegation's leader, Columbia University Law Professor Mark Bareney, who also chairs the WRC board.

The WRC is a factory watchdog group established by 67 colleges and universities. WASHINGTON — The nation's top TV executives told Congress a national uniform poll closing time would eliminate the issue of networks announcing winners in some states before polls in other states are closed. In an eight-hour hearing of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, the network presidents Wednesday also pledged that they will wait until all the polls in a state are closed before declaring a winner in that state and take other steps to prevent a recurrence of events that led to the premature — and incorrect — declarations of the Florida presidential race.

Requests for heating assistance soar

Requests for heating assistance soar WASHINGTON — Nearly 5 million households, about a quarter more than last winter, are having serious enough problems meeting winter heating costs that they've asked for government help, according to a nationwide survey. "Prices soar, temperatures plummet and poor families are left out in the cold," said Mark Wolfe, director of an association that represents state low-income energy assistance officials. The reports from the state offices show that so far this year the number of households seeking help has increased by 1.1 million, a 26 percent jump over last winter. In some states the number of applicants has nearly doubled and is likely to go still higher, officials said.

China warns against censure effort

BEJJING — Calling for dialogue instead of confrontation, China on Thursday kicked off its annual effort to fight off attempts to criticize its human rights record at an upcoming United Nations meeting. On Wednesday, a bipartisan group of 11 U.S. senators urged President Bush to sponsor such a resolution.



Clinton's comments were not recorded, but a transcript of Rivera's notes was provided to The Associated Press. A call to Clinton's transition of-fice was not returned.

Meanwhile, Arafat repeated his charge that Israel is using a new form of gas, stronger than tear gas, in the southern Gaza Strip. The Israeli military called the allegation "a lie."

Salvadorans cry out for help

'We need food': Resources needed after second earthquake; more than 200 dead

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador — With hospitals running out of beds, blood and medicine, officials appealed for international help for thousands of victims from Salvador's second deadly earthquake in a month.

Villagers who live along the Pan American Highway that links the quake zone to the capital strung paper signs across the road Thursday reading "We need help," "We need food," and "We need water."

highways blocked rescue workers on Wednesday from reaching stricken communities.

"Blood reserves have run out, we urgently need donors, and the hospitals have no space," Salvadoran Red Cross spokesman Carlos Lopez said.

Medical centers throughout the country — already overwhelmed by the thousands injured in last month's deadly quake—could not handle the additional victims from Tuesday's 6.6-magnitude temblor.

The National Emergency Committee on Thursday put the death toll at 276, with 2,716 injured, 17,925 houses destroyed and nearly 123,000 people suffering property damage.

damage. In San Vicente, a central city of 40,000 that was one of the hardest hit, the San Gertrudis Hospital was rendered practically useless, its walls cracked by the force of the quake and its administrative offices des

destroyed.

Forced to improvise, doctors created a makeshift hospital outside Wednesday, examining quake victims in the beds of pickups with IV lines strung from bamboo

The streets were crowded with funeral processions, the coffins sometimes decorated with bougainvillea vines plucked from the trees for want of anything more formal.


Nations around the world provided help in the wake of January's quake, which caused an estimated \$1 billion in damage, nearly half the annual budget.

On Wednesday, the U.S. Agency for International Development said it would provide an additional \$275,000 for emergency replief supplies and \$3 million for emergency housing to meet immediate needs in the wake of the latest disaster. The U.S. Southern Command, which oversees all milliary activities in the southern hemisphere, also sent three helicopters and 20 personnel to help with medical and evacuation needs.

Mexico sent &5 soldiers and Air Force personnel to the country Wednesday, along with a team of nine doctors and other medical personnel and more than a ton of medical supplies.

OxyContin is a powerful prescription painkiller released in 1996 to help cancer victims and others suffering severe, chronic pain. Law enforcement officials say the drug sells illegally for as much as \$1 a milligram, and is to blame for the recent rise in drug-related deaths in the state. Experts believe that abuse of the drug is reaching epidemic proportions, but others, such as Tom Collins, interim head of the state's program to combat IV drug abuse, said Friday he had never heard of OxyContin. However, a drug bust last week, dubbed OxyFest 2001, resulted in the arrest of over 200 OxyContin dealers and attracted attention from Kentucky newspapers, national TV networks and reporters from The New York Times. While some are denying the seriousness of the

While some are denying the seriousness of the situation, there's little doubt that OxyContin's presence in eastern Kentucky has had a devastat-ing affect on the local population. What do you think should be done about the epidemic, if any-thing? What does this say about our state and our ability to care for Kentucky's drug addicts?


