the federal government for 8,000 doses of
smallpox vaccine, public health officials
said Thursday. When President Bush
gives the order and the federal government releases vaccine, front-line medical
workers who volunteer and pass two medical screenings are to be vaccinated at 10
or 12 local health departments.
Vaccinations are unlikely before Jan. 24,
when newly enacted federal liability protections take effect, officials said. The
vaccine is highly effective against smallpox but causes dangerous side effects in
many people and is fatal in about one
case in 1 million. "The whole business of

smallpox is based on risk," Dr. Rice
Leach, commissioner of the state
Department for Public Health, said at a
news conference Thursday, Smallpox was
declared eradicated worldwide in 1980,
but experts fear that unauthorized stocks

SUU My. Immates could get out early FRANKFORT — As many as 500 state inmates serving their time in local jails will probably use an early release as the state tries to cope with its budget problems. Gov Paul Patton said Wednesday. "We've got to get this thing under control." Patton said in an impromptu interview. There are about 4.200 state inmates in county jails. Most are Class D felons, those with the least dangerous or violent charges, whose sentences are from one to five years" incarceration. The releases will have the snowballing effect of throwing many local jail budgets into disarray because they depend on state income for inmate housing to operate their own facilities. "The cheapest thing we can do for one extra prisoner is keep them in a state institution," Patton said. The early-release program will target nonviolent offenders. "I don't see any other alternative," Patton said.

30,000 gallons of alcohol starts fire

TACOMA, Wash. — A spectacular rail-car fire fueled by 30,000 gallons of spilled alcohol sent flames high into the air, prompt-ing the evacuation of nearby businesses and ach me theset up some general series and alcohol sent flames high into the air, prompting the evacuation of nearby businesses and halting traffic in an industrial area. No one was injured in the Wednesday afternoon blaze. The rallcar contained denatured alcohol, a fuel additive that made for a roaring blaze but did not pose any significant health threat from fumes, said Bill Dunbar, an Environmental Protection Agency spokesman. Businesses within a six-block area were temporarily evacuated as a precaution, said Fire Deputy Chief Gary Schiesz. About 30,000 gallons of alcohol spilled and an unknown amount that did not burn soaked into the ground or the nearby Puyallup River, said Sandy Howard, a spokeswoman for the state Ecology Department. Study finds music and memory link

Study finds music and memory link WASHINGTON—Sounds from the radio slip into a melody and suddenly your mind skips back to an evening of romance and happy times. It happens to everybody, but until now science was unsure just why. A new study by researchers at Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H., suggests that recalling that melody is the job of a part of the brain known as the rostromedial prefrontal cortex. A team led by researcher Petr Janata of Dartmouth's Center for Cognitive Neuroscience explored the mind's memory for tunes by using functional magnetic resonance imaging, which detects the part of the brain active in response to specific stimuli. They found that the ability to recognize music is contained in a centrally located Iney found that the ability to recognize music is contained in a centrally located area just behind the forehead. "Our results provide a stronger foundation for explaining the link between music, emotion and the brain," Janata said.

Helicopter crashes, kills U.S. soldiers

SANTA CRUZ DE YOJOA, Honduras — An American Black Hawk helicopter crashed in the hills of central Honduras crashed in the hills of central Honduras during a night training exercise, killing five U.S. soldiers. The helicopter, from Soto Cano Air Force Base in Palmerola, Honduras, crashed about 9 nm. Wednesday while on routine training, said Lt. Col. Bill Costello, a spokesman for the U.S. Southern Command in Florida. "Right now, we are classifying it as a training accident." Costello said Thursday. "It is being investigated." The names of the dead were being withheld until their families could be notified. The crew belonged to the 1st Battalion, 228th Aviation Regiment, based at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico. There had been heavy rains in the area over the past three days, but the cause of the crash was not known.

Al-Qaida may be training in Pakistan

Al-Qaida may be training in Pakistan PESHAWAR, Pakistan — Suicide squads are being trained in Pakistan by al-Qaida operatives to hit targets in Afghanistan and the bombers' families are being promised \$50,000, say Afghan and Pakistani sources. The Pakistani government denies the presence of camps here. But privately, some officials in Pakistan's intelligence community and Interior Ministry say they believe there is such bomb training and that it is protected by Pakistan imilitants and Taiban sympathizers in the Pakistan military. The nephew of Maulvi Abdul Kabir, the Tailban's No. 3 man, says the training camps are in Bajour and Mansehar, towns in Pakistan's North West Frontier Province. The nephew asked that his name not be used, saying he feared retailation from both the Tailbanan on that his hame not be used, saying he leare retaliation from both the Taliban and Pakistanis. He said he agreed to an exclu-sive interview with The Associated Press on Tuesday because he believes suicide bombing is wrong.

Coaching search begins, but blacks left off list

As the rumors fly about possible candidates As the full of six about possible cambanates to fill UK's football coaching vacancy, it merits noting that none of the mentioned candidates is black. Considering the Southeastern Conference's history, this does not come as a news flash.

The SEC has never seen a black head football coach. And for at least the last two seasons, South Carolina's Charlie Strong, a defensive coordinator, has been the only top-tier black assis-

ordinator, has been the only top-tier brack such tant in the conference.

The numbers are just as inexcusable across the nation. Four blacks began the 2002 season as head coaches: Notre Dame's Tyrone Willingham, Michigan State's Bobby Williams, San Jose State's Fitz Hill and New Mexico State's Tony Samuel. Michigan State canned Williams in the middle of an underachieving season. This middle of an underachieving season. This means that black coaches fill three out of 117 Division I-A head coaching jobs. Or, they make up less than three percent the head coaches while blacks make up 47 percent of the players, ac-cording to an article published in the Christian Science Monitor

On its behalf, Michigan State actively sought a black replacement for Williams. The school of-fered the position to Marvin Lewis, the defensive coordinator for the NFL's Washington Red-skins, who turned the job down. Plus, Michigan State did more than most schools. As Richard Lapchick, the founder and

job are Mike Riley an assistant coach for the Job are Mike Kiley, an assistant coach for the NFL's New Orleans Saints, Norm Chow, the offen-sive coordinator for the University of Southern California and Walt Harris, the head coach at the

University of Pittsburgh — who are all white.
Surprisingly enough, this is a step backward for UK. When former Athletics Director C.M.
Newton sought a successor for Bill Curry in 1996, he contacted at least two blacks coaches. Larry Kirksey, a former Kentucky State University coach who is now wide receivers coach for the NFL's Detroit Lions, was granted a formal inter-view and was one of three finalists. Newton also

view and was one of three nailists. Newton also talked to Sherman Lewis, then offensive coordinator for the NFL's Green Bay Packers, but Lewis said he was never formerly interviewed.

There are qualified black coaches out there. Strong's defense, for example, limited the Cats to six points in 2001. This season UK scored 12 against his unit, but managed only a safety in the second half. If UK fails even to consider a black coach for its vacancy, it will be doing its part to keep black out of top ioles Plus UK Ath. part to keep blacks out of top jobs. Plus, UK Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart will be hindering his search for the best possible candidate.

Fred Phelps cannot be described as a hate-spewing creature. Those three words can't possibly do the man justice.




