collegiate lectures

Prof. Roark reported on behalf of the Com. upon the intercollegiate lecture system, that his com. had opened correspondence with the Ky. colleges in relation to this matter, but that in most cases the replies had been non-committal. So far as other institutions accept the proposition, the com. favors the consummation of the scheme, provided the college authorities will pay the expenses of those who visit us.

On motion it was ordered that the report be accepted and the com. be continued.

Pres. Patterson announced as the special business for this meeting, the devising of some plan by which the delinquents in the military department can be constrained to complete the required squad drill upon Saturdays.

It was suggested that students might be suspended from all college exercises until this drill was worked off, but this plan met with considerable opposition.
