TO ALL WHO SHALL SEE THESE PRESENTS, GREETING.

Know ye, That, reposing special trust and confidence in the patriotism, valor, fidelity, and abilities of Edward M. Albert, the President does hereby appoint him *Captain* in the *Second* Regiment of *Colored Troops* in the service of the United States, to rank as such from the day of his muster into service by the duly appointed Commissary of Musters for the command to which said Regiment belongs.

He is therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of *Captain* by doing and performing all manner of things thereunto belonging. And I do strictly charge and require all Officers and Soldiers under his command to be obedient to his orders as *Captain*. And he is to obey and follow such orders and directions from time to time, as he shall receive from me, or the future Secretary of War or other Superior Officers set over him, according to the rules and discipline of War. This Appointment to continue in force during the pleasure of the President for the time being.

(Given under my hand at the War Department, in the City of Washington, D. C. this *5th* day of *September* in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *Eighty four*.)
