The General Faculty met in special session Monday afternoon, February 21, 1916, President Barker presiding. Quorum present.

It was announced by the President that the faculty was called to consider Lieutenant Underwood's resolution requiring law students to drill under the same rules and regulations as other students of the University. The following substitute motion was offered by Dean Lafferty:

"BE IT RESOLVED that a Committee of three be appointed to take up the question of outlining a policy to be pursued by this University in the future concerning the above question. That the Committee gather facts such proof as may be necessary to fix an advisable plan based upon the policies of similar institutions and the conditions in this State and in this institution, and report a recommendation to the faculty."

After a general discussion, this motion was adopted. Professors Anderson, Miller and Melcher were appointed as members of the committee and requested to report, if possible, at the next regular meeting March 3rd.

The following motion offered by Professor Melcher was adopted:

"RESOLVED that suitable exercises be held in Chapel, Tuesday, February the twenty-second, at ten o'clock in honor of Washington's Birthday, and the fact that we are at peace with the world. And that the battalion attend these exercises in uniform, and that the City Commissioners, the Sons of the Revolution, the Daughters of the Revolution and the other civic and patriotic organizations be invited to attend."

Upon motion of Professor Allen, it was voted that the members of the faculty take luncheon at the Phoenix Hotel at 12:30 o'clock after the exercises, and that this be made an annual affair. The following committee was appointed to arrange luncheon for February 22, 1916:
