In the May issue of the Agriculture Commission Bulletin, published by the American Bankers Association. Dean T. P. Cooper, head oi the Agricultural College of the University, has written an article entitled "Alms of the Agricultura College." in which he states the aims and purposes of the college.

"The dissemination of knowledge to every farm home, to the end that agriculture may be the best, the most attractive, and the soundest industry to our Commonwealth.

"The improvement and conservation of the soil that there may be a
secure foundation for a sound, progressive and profitable agriculture.
"A balanced agriculture based up-

"A balanced agriculture based upon livestock production; an increased profit from livestock through better selection and breeding, through more efficient and less expensive feeding, and through the control and eradication of animal diseases.

"A balanced agriculture that will provide for the grawing of such products as may be adapted to the soil, climate, markets, and livestock needs; that takes into consideration the requirements of the home, and that will make the best use of land, labor, and capital.

"Economic research and nivesagation which will lead to the standardization and effective marketing of all farm products, and the growing of these products on well organized and well operated farms.
