With the twents-fourth anniversary of the signing of the Armistice just past, now would be an opportune time for a consideration of what went wrong.

On November 11, 1918, we won a war which was fought to "make the world safe for democracy." A mere twenty-four years later, we are again fighting to "preserve the better way of living." Obviously, something is wrong. If we fought to make the world safe for democracy lefore, and woon, why, then, the present conflict.

True enough, we probably meant well by our idealistic slogans; but that's just as far as we get, as soon as the first trace of victory was perceivable — namely, the winning of the war—hameria dropped out of the picture and failed to fight to the end. This was her great mistake.
