after the "Teacher" Splash!

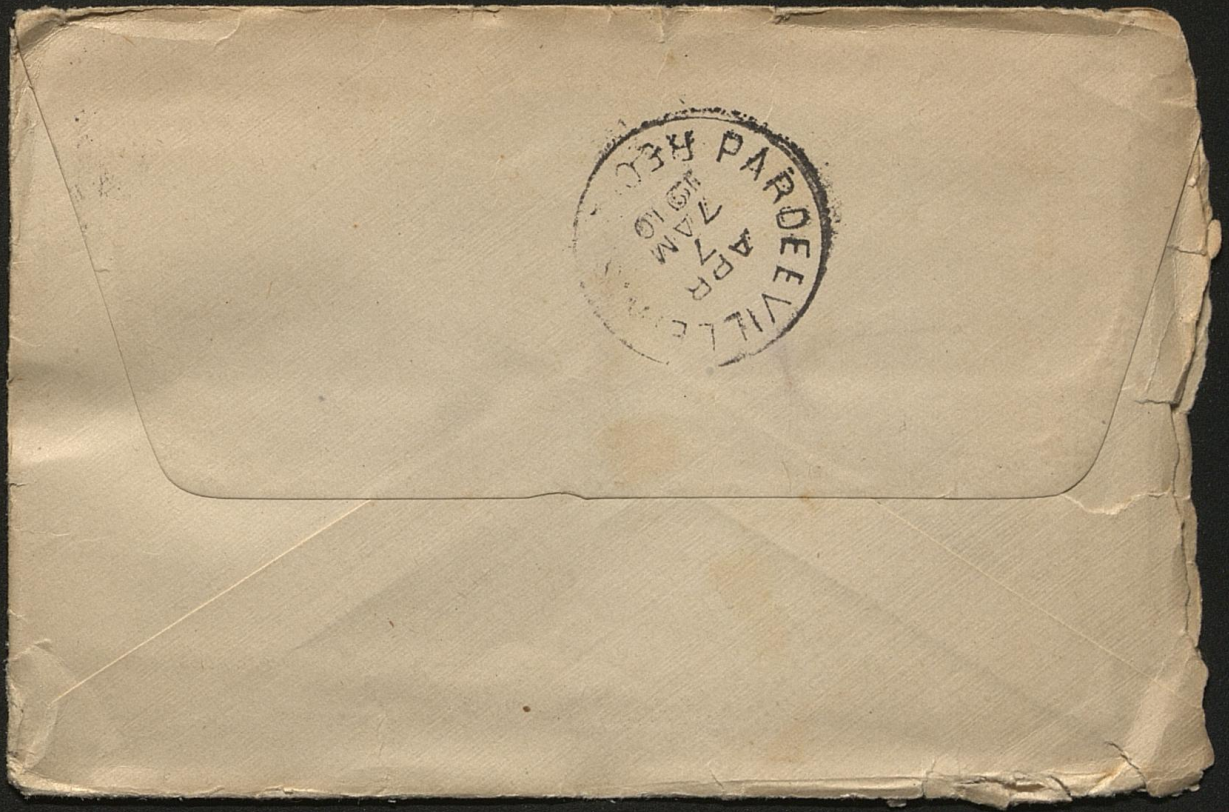

You didn't mention it.

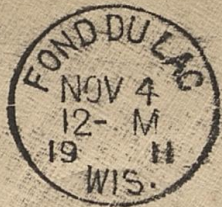
How is Ethel? Give her my

hotels are all ^{are} crowded, so I hear.

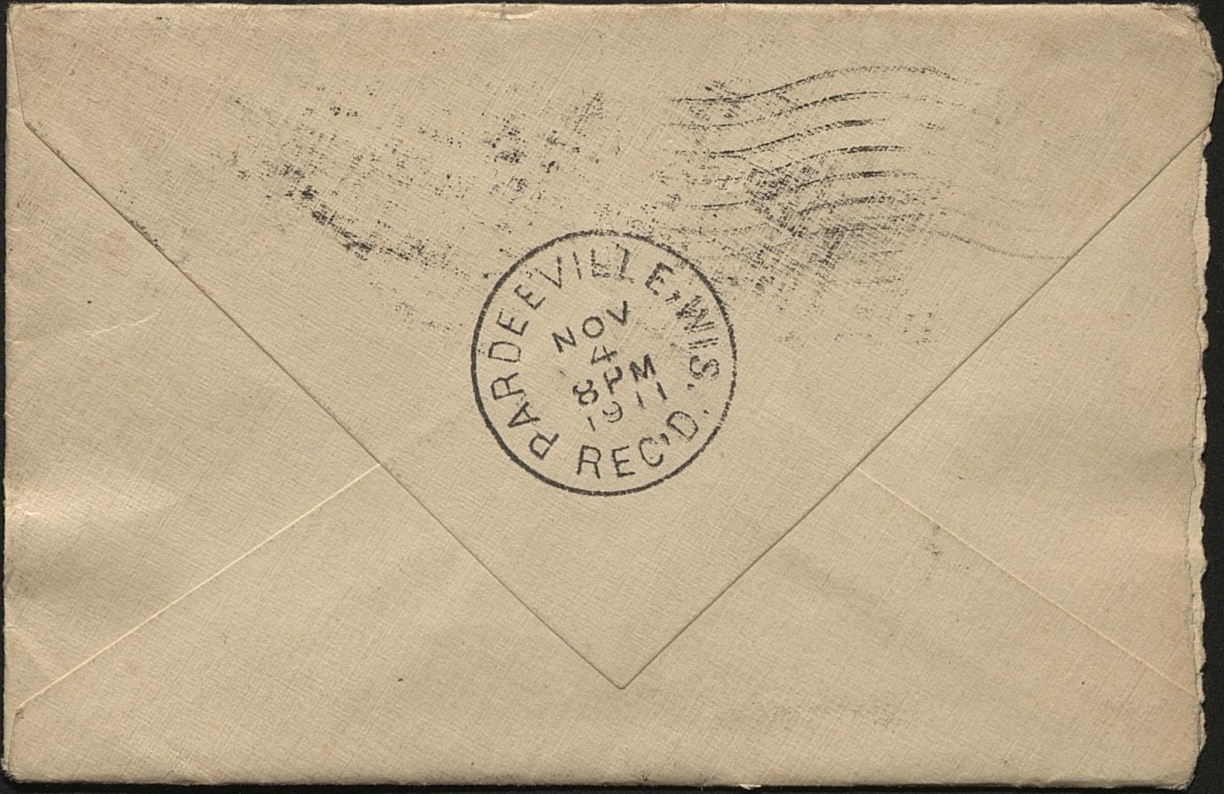
Well, Stanley this is some

something swell.

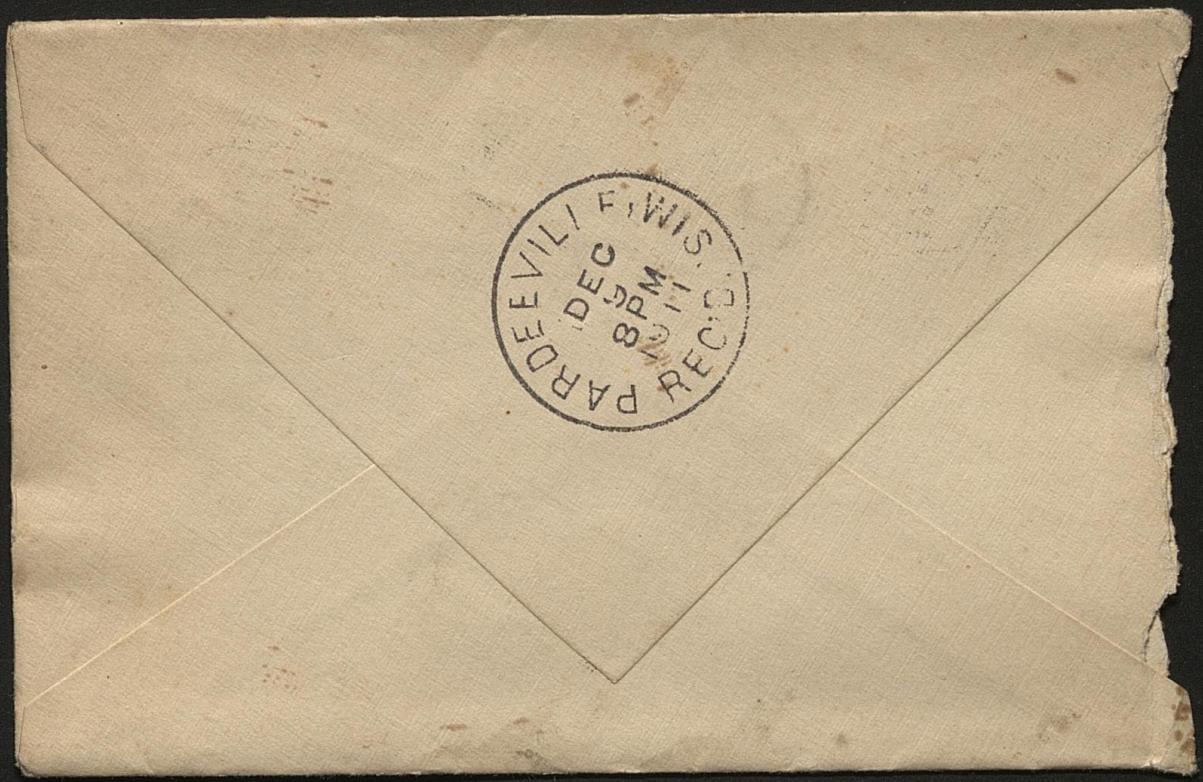
What's the excitement out
