





# Johnson's actions upset Lewis

CINCINNATI — Chad Johnson has been warned to watch the choreography.

The trash-talking receiver who loves to entertain the crowd after a touchdown put the Cincinnati Bengals' biggest comeback of the season at risk with his latest move.

move.
Coach Marvin Lewis castigated him on the sideline
Sunday after his throat-slash
gesture after a touchdown
drew a 15-yard penalty. The
Bengals overcame it, holding
on for a 27-24 victory over
Seattle.

Johnson said Wednesday that he hadn't been fined by the NFL, an indication that the league accepted his ex-planation that it was an in-nocent mistake.

"They would have done it already," said Johnson, who has a lot of firsthand knowledge of the league's methods for fines. 'Tim sure they understand what I meant."

His head coach is less

His head coach is less understanding.

Lewis logged over to Johnson as he returned from the end zone after Sunday's display, and berated him at length on the side line. The first-year head coach made it sink in that every action — even one done in fun — has consequences.

"That's the significance
of what you do, "Lewis said,
"We are beginning to learn
that this is a team game. It's
not the Chad Johnson show,
it's a team game He understands and is remorseful."

Johnson is enjoying his emergence as one of the league's top young receivers. His 53-yard touchdown catch Sunday left him with 643 yards and 18.4-yards per

catch in seven games.

He started getting attention with his catches and his win guarantees last season, when the Bengals finished 2-14. Most of his trash talking is playful rather than malicious—he even makes fun of himself.

Last week, Johnson sug-ested there's no pressure on im now that he's become the eader of the Bengals' receiv-

leader of the Bengals' receiving corps.

"That's just me," he said.
"I worked my way from the bottom up. Every week, it's not yooling to get better. There are three things in life that are certain: death, taxes and not being able to cover me."

He's been fined \$20,000 this season for violating the league's uniform regulations—shirt not tucked in and so forth. He got another \$5,000 fine for pretending to take a photograph in the end zone with Peter Warrick to celebrate a touchdown in Cleveland.



# New basketball practice facility will benefit athletic programs

The UK men's and women's basketball teams will move into a brand new practice facility by the fall semester in 2006.

On Wednesday the Board of Trustees unani-mously approved the contract for the project's \$2.5 million design phase. The facility will be a massive 92,300-square-foot complex housing two basketball courts and two floors filled with athletic offices. It will be located behind Memorial Coliseum in the space currently occupied by a commuter lot.

As long as the displaced parking spaces from

that C-lot are compensated somewhere else, there are nothing but good things to say about this project. Warren Denny, the campus architect, says there are plans to build a new parking structure in the area to make up for the lost spaces. Officials should work to ensure that the parking structure is completed as quickly as possible and come up with a reasonable plan to accommodate students while construction is under way.


