MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE, January 24, 1927

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre January 24, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of December 13 were read and approved .

The following recommendations of the Committee on Courses of Study were approved:

✓ Political Science 158 -three credits-to replace Political Science 157
2 credits.

✓ History 160. The Civil War Period in Kentucky. Two credits.

✓ History 165. The American Civil War. Two credits.

✓ Physics 114a, 114b. Radio Communication. Two credits.

✓ Romance Languages 8. Phonetics of French. Three credits

✓ Ancient Languages 115a, 115b. Latin Compsodition. One credit

The following changes were authorized:

✓ Ancient Languages 109a, 109b. Latin Literature. Three credits. To replace
Ancient Languages 109.

✓ Ancient Languages 110a, 110b. Latin Literature. Three credits. To replace
Ancient Languages 110.

✓ Political Science 157.

✓ Commerce 126 Economics of Public Utilities . 3 credits.

✓ Animal Industry 122, Advanced Poultry Breeding, 2 credits

✓ Animal Industry 123, Exhibition and Production Poultry Judging, 2 credits

✓ Farm Engineering 10, 3 credits, Mechanics and Farmstead.

The following recommendation of the College of Law was approved:

"That no student be permitted to register in the College of Law who has not completed 60 semester credits of college work other than law, including 6 credits in English."

A combined Commerce-Law course was presented and action postponed to the next meeting of the Senate.

The Senate approved the following recommendation of the Arts and Sciences faculty:

"On December 20 the faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences recommended to the Senate that the Senior English requirement in the course leading to the degree of B. S. in Industrial Chemistry be changed to read: English, elective, 2 or 3 credits. The present requirement is three credits.

It was also recommended that seniors in Industrial Chemistry be given the option between Electrical Engineering, 4 credits, and advanced Physics, 3 credits. "
