## Cleaning industry

Lawmakers urged to tax and regulate responsibly

Associated Press

Environmental activists urged legislators to oppose the use of tax money to assist industries that pollute and called for a moratorium on chicken houses until state regulations are imposed.

The gathering Wednesday coincided with a national Sierra Club report that lists the Calles's Keystone Foods plant in Clinton County first among 10 examples of "how your tax dollars bring polluters into your neighborhood."

The event at the state Capitol amounted to an opening shot in what could be a major environmental battle of the 2000 General Assumed to the county of the coun

chicken houses until regulations are in place to prevent water from being contaminated by manure.

"This is where your governor has given millions of your tax dollars to wealthy chicken interests who are fouling your environment, hurting family farmers and endangering the health of your children." said Aloma Dew, a Sierra Club official and chairwoman of the state Environmental Quality Commission.

In the 1998 legislative session, environmentalists managed to kill a bill that would have encouraged large hog operations in western Kentucky.

#### **Cancer-Fighting Protein Found**

WASHINGTON — Researchers have found that a protein that helps regulate blood clotting can be changed into a cancer fighter that starves tumors. The discovery adds to a growing list of proteins known to block cancer by preventing blood vessel formation. Researchers led by Judah Folkman and Michael S. O'Reilly at Boston's Children's Hospital and Harvard Medical School found that antithrombin, a protein that controls the formation of blood clots, changes in molecular shape to become a cancer fighter. The transformation occurs when it is cut by an enzyme that, ironically, can originate from cancer tumors. The study of the new protein appears today in the journal Science.

## Floyd Downgraded to Tropical

WILMINGTON, N.C. — Hurricane Floyd was downgraded yesterday to a tropical storm as the center of the storm was about 10 miles south of Atlantic City, N.J. Sustained winds fell to 65 mph. Floyd roared ashore today near Cape Fear with 110 mph wind, then quickly weakened after flooding the coasts of the Carolinas and Virginia with more than a foot of rain. Some 1.4 million utility customers from South Carolina to New Jersey lost power. Schools were closed today for more than 2 million youngsters. At least seven deaths were blamed on Floyd.

## Clinton Won't Turn Over FALN

WASHINGTON — Rebuffing a congressional inquiry, President Clinton invoked executive privilege yesterday and refused to turn over documents on his decision to ofter clemency to members of a Puerto Rican separatist group. It was the fourth time the Clinton White House has used executive privilege to refuse a request from Congress. Critics have accused Clinton of making the elemency offer to help first lady Hillary Rodham Clinton's budding Senate campaign. Mrs. Clinton opposed the deal after it began to draw criticism and then was herself criticized by some prominent Puerto Ricans in New York.

#### **Bush Returns After Texas** Shooting

**Encryption Technology Limits** 

WASHINGTON — The White House agreed yesterday to allow U.S. companies to sell the most powerful data-scrambling technology overseas with virtually no restrictions, a concession to America's high-tech industry over law enforcement and national security objections. The move was a defeat for the Justice Department, which had forcefully argued that criminals and terrorists might use the technology to scramble messages about crimes or deadly plots. The decision should help U.S. companies in overseas competition — and help consumers worldwide guarantee the privacy of their e-mail and online credit-

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. — Republican presidential hopeful George W. Bush scrapped two fund-raisers today to rush home to Texas and the scene of a deadly shooting spree. The GOP frontrunner said the tragedy had not softened his progun views. He said "a wave of evil" — not a lack of gun control laws - is the cause of rampant gun violence in America. Seven people were fatally shot two nights ago at a Fort Worth, Texas, Baptist church before the gunman killed himself in a pew. Authorities did not know the man's motive.

#### **Union Auto Workers Reach** Deal

AUBURN HILLS, Mich. — The United Auto Workers won a 3 percent wage increase and a clearer path toward organizing nonunion plants at DaimlerChrysler AG in a tentative agreement yesterday on a new national contract for 75,000 workers, local union officials said. Officials at two UAW locals said they were informed the four-year proposed contract also provided a \$1,350 signing bonus for each union member.

#### Dow Ends Down 63.96

NEW YORK — Stocks ended mixed yester-day, bouncing back from a broad selloff on profit warnings from several companies. With relative-ly light volume due to Hurricane Floyd, the Dow Jones industrial average ended down 63,96 at 10,737.46. Earlier in the session, the Dow had dropped as much as 174 points. On the NYSE, losers led gainers 2,064-916. The Nasdaq fell 7.45 to 2,806.72.



## Randle El on the prowl

UK defensive coordinator Mike Major looks to stop Indiana's highly touted gunslinger

There was plenty of style, but no substance.

All that talk about Antwaan Randle El, Indiana's new quarterback last year, it was just that — talk.

UK heard about Randle Ea alright. Heard he could dance around the backfield. Heard he could leave you grasping air with a twist of his hips. Heard he was a better version of South Carolina's Anthony Wright, who had torched UK in 1997.

But when the horn sounded on UK's come from-behind 31-27 victory over the Hoosiers in Lexington last season, Randle El was a mere human again, not the super quarterback as had been billed.

The Cats' aggressive, blitzing style kept Randle EI under
wraps, holding him to just five
yards rushing on 16 attempts,
by far the best performance of
any defense against him al season. UK also held the Indiana
quarterback to just 12 completions in 34 attempts, for 162
yards.

A year later, Randle EI is
again terrorizing defenses early
on, leaving UK to realize it
must stop him to get a critical
win in Bloomington tomorrow.
"He's bigger, stronger and
understands the option better,"
UK defensive coordinator Mike
Major said of Randle EI. "Last
week (against North Carolinaja
he did a great job of pitching
the ball."

"Randle El is a real perimeter type of runner." Major said. "You don't want to blitz him out of the pocket because he's too good of an athlete to do that. You have to keep him in space because he's just too mobile. He'll run everywhere."
With the signal caller's slipperiness, defensive end Dennis Johnson said following the play from behind becomes even more important.



In August, however, the Tampa city zoning board

Instead of rushing to apply the old regulations, city councils should carefully examine existing regulations to see if they apply. If not, then the councils should work to update their zoning laws to include a definition of Internet commerce.

of the United States at large is 12.7% African-American, 11% Hispanic, and 4% Asian. All are under-represented, and the African-American and Asian "under-representation rates" are nearly equal, with enrollment at about half of what it should be.

Economic factors actually distavor Asians, many of whom are international students and comprise by far the poorest minority group on UK campus.

So why is the Office of Minority Affairs ignoring these students, who are economically disadvantaged, academically talented, and I would hate to think there was some sort of systematic discrimination occurring against a group simply because of its ethnicity, wouldn't you?

This column isn't meant to raise hell, it's meant to raise consciousness about a very serious injustice.




