The Faculty met at the call of the President at 8:45 a.m.

The President called the attention of the Faculty to the recent action of the Executive Committee with reference to membership of certain grades of students in the Athletic teams.

Resolution  
of Trustees  
regarding  
Athletics, put  
into effect.

On motion of Prof. Nelson, the President was asked to announce in Chapel that the Faculty had, under directions from the Executive Committee, resolved to put into immediate effect the resolution of the Board of Trustees relative to this matter. That resolution is as follows:-

"On motion ordered that the Executive Committee be authorized in its discretion to prohibit students in the Academy or Normal Department below the grade of Freshman from membership in any team, or from acting as substitutes therein, that receive instruction under a professional trainer, or that gives a challenge to or entertains a challenge from any team outside of this institution, or plays elsewhere than on the College grounds."

Prof. Blanton was called in to explain a conflict between part of his Caesar class and the Freshman Algebra, in the matter of time of recitation. Prof. Wernick stated that there was the same difficulty in his work. On motion of Prof. Mathews it was recom-

recommended that the conflict be ob-  
viated by requiring the students in  
the Caesar class to omit the Preliminary  
Algebra until the work in Caesar was  
completed; and that the principle be  
established, of requiring all students to  
take the work in the lower class in all  
cases where it conflicted in time of  
recitation with the work of a higher  
class.

The cases of Messrs. Herrick and J. Woods  
were laid before the Faculty. These gentle-  
men desired to be relieved of work in  
certain branches which had been in-  
troduced into the schedule after  
they had entered the course. regard-  
ing these cases, and all similar ones,  
it was resolved, on motion of  
Prof. Nelson, that unless a schedule  
be changed after the end of any  
given Sophomore year, students in  
the regular courses be required to  
take the work as scheduled.

Students to

On motion of Dr. Kastle it was  
resolved to have a reclassification  
of students at the end of each  
Term [at the beginning of each term], by  
the Deans of their respective courses.

Appointment

On motion of Prof. Miller a  
Committee was appointed to  
consider the whole matter of  
entrance examinations and delays at  
the opening of the College year. The Com-  
mittee as appointed by the Chair con-  
sists of Profs. Miller, Nelson, White, Mathews,  
Kastle.
