

A & M. College of Kentucky May 26-1906.

The faculty met in the president's office at 4 P.M. those present being President Patterson, professors James White, Neville, Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Penn, Wernicke, Brooks, Markingie, Norwood,raig, Burt, M. White and Palmer.

May. Burt, reported on behalf of his committee on absences, that the com. had ordered two men, H. E. Taylor and A. B. Keeney, to appear before the faculty. These men came before the faculty but offered as their only excuse for the repeated absences, that they were induced to leave their work on account of the urgent demands of their mates that they should participate in certain match games of base ball.

On motion of Prof. White it was ordered by unanimous vote upon each in turn, that these young men be suspended for the remainder of the term, and the secretary was instructed to so notify their parents.

An agenda with an order of the faculty given Apr. 21. Maj. Burt, Chairman, presented as a part of his annual report a scheme for the reorganization of the athletic affairs of the college.

Upon motion of Prof. Wernicke, seconded by Prof. Patterson, it was ordered that discussion of these recommendations be deferred until the next meeting of the faculty.

Maj. Burt read a financial statement condensed from the several student managers of classes and from the treasurer's reports.

Upon motion of C. W. Mathews, seconded by Prof.raig, it was ordered that an auditing com. of three be appointed to audit these financial reports.

President Patterson appointed Prof. Wernicke, Dr. Pryor, and Prof. White upon this committee.
