

The region's main traffic artery -- the Washington-Baltimore boulevard -- already is loaded to capacity. It will be supplemented by two new highways, laid out so that through traffic will be able to by-pass both cities. In addition, a parkway has been proposed to provide a fitting northern approach to the nation's capital. The new town has been carefully fitted into this transport pattern. It is served by the Boulevard and two good secondary roads; it lies just north of the proposed southern highway; the parkway will run through its greenbelt. Bus and rail lines are within easy reach, and Washington is only 15 minutes away by automobile.
