- A regional plan is a design for the orderly development of any area which forms a natural economic or geographical unit.
- · A good plan must do four jobs:
 - Outline the best use of the land and natural resources.
 - Direct the growth of transport into a co-ordinated system.
 - Guide the expansion of cities, so that homes, parks, industries, and utilities are properly placed.
 - Prevent short-signted and conflicting action by individuals and local authorities.
- A plan for the Washington-Baltimore region has been drawn up by the Maryland State Planning Commission. It is being put into effect by state, federal, and local agencies.
- The following maps show now the greenbelt town at Berwyn, Maryland, is being ouilt as an integral part of this regional plan.
