Civil War Bible Is Historical Diary

By KAYE MARTIN

"Mr. Edward Prince, not fully appreciating the word of God, went on a pillaging expedition to Liuka, Mississippi; and when about to be confronted with Christians, ran away, leaving his affectionate sister's gift to be received by John Reid."

This passage introduces a simple story which unfolds within the pages of an old Civil War Bible, which was given to the University two years ago. The Bible was cwned by Lt. Col. Edward Prince, of the 7th Illinois Cavalry, Union Army of the United States. It had been given to him by his sister, Ann Payson, in August, 1849.

The Bible was found on the battlefield by John Reid, a Confederate soldier, who was enraged by the heathen carelessness of Col. Prince.


