FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

FOREWORD

In presenting this report we follow a yearly custom of giving our supporters the complete accounting of all our affairs. The audits have not been condensed, the gifts of the 1526 subscribers are acknowledged by name, except where anonymity was requested, and donations in kind as well as in money are reported in full. The annual inventory of the property of the organization is recorded, and the value of the property estimated. The report closes with a detailed statement of the work of the nursing service.

In no other of the five years since the Frontier Nursing Service began has the raising of money been as difficult as in this. But loyal friends stood by and new friends have arisen. The budget planned before the market crash, and allowing for expansion, has been met in full, and money found for new buildings and needed improvements. The report shows that our receipts, during this hardest of all years for philanthropies, totaled *\$151,900.88, including endowments and excluding refunds and the nurses' board to the Hyden Hospital. The costs of promotion for raising this money were \$5,687.94, or only 3.67 per cent of the whole. That is a good financial record but not an easy one.

In the field, too, everything has been harder this past year than before. Thousands of mountaineers, who sought better opportunities for their families in the towns along the railroads,

have lost their jobs and poured back into the mountains, without cows, chickens, pigs or gardens—seeking subsistence in a country where the margin of living is never far above the hunger level. We call them our cornbread line—and their need can be met only by providing employment. This situation makes us beg *now* only the more urgently for the new hospital wing and the new administration building we badly need, both of which would be built mainly by local labor. The budget of \$113,175.00 for the coming year, yet to be raised, allows for operating two new centers, for which the money has already been subscribed, whose construction would employ local labor in other sections of the large territory we serve.

Hunger and pain—both have been our daily companions this past winter. Children were reported to us by neighbors passing down the creek, as crying for food. Among our smallest children, six years and under, 23 per cent live in families that have no cow—no milk, and not always enough cornbread and potatoes. A little mountain girl cared for by Linda Neville put it like this: “I haint been hungry once since I come to see you.”

Hunger and pain! A little boy with a tubercular hip who went down eleven months ago to the Children’s Free Hospital in Louisville, and has just come back, remembered the horseback ride out, and spoke up from his seat behind the rider coming in: “I’ve most forgot what it feels like to be a’hurtin’.”

The nursing record with which this report closes is a story of the alleviation of pain: through the prevention of disease or in caring for the sick, in all 6,972 people, and in attending without the loss of a mother 232 women in childbirth. Nobody really knows anything accurate about the waste of life, about the amount of disease and pain in the heart of a country like ours. Among the maternal deaths which occurred this past year in areas as remote as our own, and adjacent to us, of which the knowledge filters slowly through, was that of Chlo C— of Bullskin Creek. She went into labor on a Sunday in April—attended only by two old neighbors acting as midwives, and died the following Thursday with her baby still unborn—one of its hands presenting. She did not die *in* childbirth. She died *of* child-

birth. What American who hears her story but will vow to help put an end to the agonizing deaths from childbirth of our young women, alone and unattended?

The Fifth Annual Report of the Frontier Nursing Service is herewith presented to its subscribers and supporters by the officers and trustees.

REPORT OF THE NURSING WORK of the FRONTIER NURSING SERVICE

April 30, 1929—May 1, 1930

The work of the Frontier Nursing Service during the past year was handled by 31 nurses who worked a total of 199 1-2 months. There was an average of 16 5-8 nurses on duty. Five nurses doing supervision worked 20 5-6 months or an average of 1 3-4 nurses. Thirteen nurses on hospital duty only worked a total of 29 11-12 months, an average of 2 1-2 nurses. Twenty-six district nurses worked a total of 148 23-30 months, an average of 12 2-5 nurses. This average includes the time spent on duty only and not vacation or sick leave or absence for study or in visiting for observation. The work done is outlined briefly as follows:

There were 6972 people in 1345 families attended during the year by the Service. Of these, 816 were babies under two years of age, which have been seen at least once a month and, as far as possible, twice a month. These figures also included 1164 children from two to six years of age and 2340 school children.

The total number of children followed was 4320.

Bedside nursing care has been given to 301 very sick people of whom 15 have died and 286 have recovered.

The nurses paid 22,347 visits to 8563 families and received 10,459 visits at the nursing centers. They were on duty 41,510 hours.

There have been 40 patients and their attendants transported to Lexington, Richmond, Louisville and Cincinnati, on passes given them and their nurses by the Louisville & Nashville Railroad, and 2 transported by the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad.

The little hospital at Hyden was occupied 2,289 days by 169 patients.

GROUP WORK

There was an estimated attendance of 2,181 at 16 public gatherings in which the nurses took part.

At 434 special conferences, special medical clinics by doctors, etc., there was a known attendance of 6,270 men, women and children.

INOCULATIONS

At the request of the State Board of Health, and under the direction of the County Health Officer in one of the counties (Leslie), the nurses gave inoculations in Clay and Leslie Counties as follows:

MIDWIFERY

The nurse-midwives have delivered 232 women in child-birth (including one miscarriage) during the year, and have given them pre-natal and post partum care. There were five stillbirths. We report with deep thankfulness that there has been no maternal death.

Doctors were called in ten times for the following abnormal conditions: prolonged 1st stage; ante-natal hemorrhage; pre-eclampsia; ovarian cyst; placenta praevia (two cases); retained placenta; persistent transverse (two cases, one with twins); delayed 2nd stage. Two patients were taken out to hospitals at Manchester and Lexington, one for small measurements and one because of a bad heart condition.

The midwifery cases closed during the year were 244. There were admitted 269 new cases. Ninety-one midwifery cases are registered at the present date and carried forward as expectant mothers.

LOCAL COOPERATION

We are often asked how much cooperation we get from our neighbors and patients. The following article written by one of the nurses, Miss Betty Lester, and reprinted by permission from *The Survey*, carries an account of one piece of cooperation just as it came about.

THE CLINIC THE NEIGHBORS BUILT

Where Thousandsticks Creek joins Bull Creek in Leslie County, Kentucky, there stands a small wooden building insignificant in itself and yet a building of which we who know its history are justly proud. It is a clinic given and built by the people who live on these creeks for the use of the Frontier Nursing Service in its work there.

For four years one of the frontier nurses has held a clinic every Thursday in the summer in the school house and in the winter in a room in the schoolmaster's house. Usually there is a good attendance, but the women do not like discussing their ailments with other people listening and we have had no second room where nurse and patient might talk alone. We needed a clinic building with a waiting room and consulting room, but there was no way of paying for it.

Life is hard in the mountains and the people often pay their medicine and midwifery accounts with vegetables, chickens and eggs, because they have no money. Still every man owns his own land, poor though it is, and there is an abundance of timber. The one way of getting help was to ask each man to give a certain amount of timber. I discussed it with Charlie Woods, the schoolmaster, who is one of the best friends the service has in the mountains, and he agreed that if we could get the men interested we could have what we wanted. I knew the women would help, because it was they who wanted the clinic.

To every man I met on my rounds I explained our plan, and each agreed to help. At the next Parent-Teachers' meeting

Charlie and I again explained our plan and we discussed the various kinds and quantities of timber together with the size of the building. Soon everybody was full of the idea and each man at the meeting promised his share. A certain amount was allotted to each man, who had to cut the logs, haul them to the mill, and then take the planks to the building site.

There were men not at the meeting who had promised help, and Charlie gave a list suggesting what I might ask from each

one. I knew who had promised and I went first to Ballard Napier whose little granddaughter had been ill of pneumonia. She had recovered, and all the family were grateful to the service. Both Ballard and his son-in-law, John Hoskins, were home when I made my request for two hundred feet of white oak timber. I was so surprised when they both laughed. I wondered if I had made a silly blunder until John said, "Well, Miss Lester, that's nothing at all. We will do our part and give four hundred feet. If you want some more come back for it." That proof of willingness to help was such great encouragement that I did not

mind asking the other men. Every one was eager to help and give and I could have had far more than I needed.

The next thing was to get the logs cut and hauled. One of the thrills of my life was the sight of Elmer Begley hauling the first log to the mill. After the first log, the rest soon followed like sheep. I arranged with George Osbourne to get them sawed at his sawmill on a certain day by men who wanted to do the sawing for their share of the work.

It was a Thursday of early March I remember—the sun was shining and spring was in the air. I was not hurrying to clinic that morning because it was too beautiful a day. Nobody was sick on the district, the lumber was being sawed, and all seemed right with the world. Then catastrophe happened.

I saw Bob Couch on his mule hurrying towards me, his face white and scared. Before I could ask what was wrong he said, "George Osbourne's mill has blown up. Hiram Young's killed and they want you to go up there. Where is the doctor?" I told him where he could find the doctor, and I raced off on my horse, Raven, to the scene of the tragedy.

Hiram was not dead, but his face, arms and chest were badly burned, and he had a scalp wound and a broken leg. Over those rough and steep mountain sides, it took two hours to get a doctor there. We tried hard to save him. When he recovered from the shock twenty-five men in relay carried him four miles over the mountains to our hospital in Hyden, but he died a week later. There is one thing I will always remember. When I was helping to dress his burns one day he said, "You women are mighty good and if I get out of this shape I'll help put up your house." Such is the gratitude of our friends in the mountains and it makes our work much easier to know that it is appreciated.

All this happened in March and months went by before we could do anything about the lumber. Three hundred feet out of two thousand had been sawed before the accident, but now there was no mill to carry on the work. People would sometimes say to me, "It looks like you will never get your house put up." I would agree with them, although I was hoping all the time that George would buy a new mill. Various rumors started and I

would enquire if a new mill was coming, while I continued to hold clinic in the same old way.

At last joyful news came that George really had ordered a new gasoline engine. It was he who told me, so I knew it was not just another rumor. Even then we had another period of waiting because it is not an easy matter to order an engine, get it sent to the nearest depot and hauled on a mule wagon over the stony creeks and mountains to its destination. However, our engine finally came and the clinic lumber was sawed first and then hauled to the site.

Charlie immediately set a day for the working. Sixteen men appeared early in the morning and we started building. After many months of waiting, not always patiently, the clinic building went up. Not in one day only, because we do not work quickly, without modern tools, and it took several days of voluntary labor. The men, anxious to give the best they could, added a front porch and announced their intention of fencing in the surrounding ground so that we might have a garden. This will be done by degrees.

The women came one morning and we cleaned the floors, papered the walls, and made the two rooms as beautiful as possible for the opening. Just before Christmas the children had their program and the Christmas tree in the school house, and on that day Mrs. Breckinridge, after a wonderful speech, full of inspiring thoughts and encouragement, unlocked the clinic door.

Now everybody can come to clinic and we love our "little house by the creek" where all are welcome.
