While Gov. Ernie Fletcher advocated almost fully funding UK's two biggest capital construction projects during his budget address in Frankfort last night, UK's general fund did not get similar

good news.

If Fletcher's recommendation holds, it would virtually guarantee a double-digit tuition increase for the fourth straight school year, as laid out in UK's top-20 business plan.

Fletcher recommended the distribution of \$50 million in general operating funds to the state's nine universities and the Kentucky Community and Technical College System over the next two years. In that two-year span, UK would receive more than \$11 million of that money, according to budget data and the state's formula for distributing that pool of money.

"This amount is less than requested by the Council on Postsecondary Education and the institutions," Fletcher said.
"It is affordable and sustainable and is distributed in a manner that will maximize our return on investment.

"Frankly, this is an area where I would like to do more," he said.

According to UK's top-20 business plan, UK needs \$18 million more in general funds than last year from the legislature—which would equate to a nine percent tuition increase. UK President Lee Todd said he wasn't sure how much of that funding UK would ultimately receive under Fletcher's proposal, but he admitted it would "definitely" be less than the \$14 million than the postsecondary council had recommended. Todd said he's still optimistic that UK will receive the funding it asked for. "This is the first step in the process," he said. "We have a lot of work to do. I'll continue to meet with legislators to present our top-20 plan.

Continued tsunami aid well worth the funding

All too often, relief efforts on both a national and global scale are relegated to the Red Cross or the United Nations. After a disaster, spot-crisis media coverage highlighted, then rarely followed up to remind viewers or readers that they can aid in such efforts. But the UK community hasn't forgotten 2004's tsunami disaster in Indonesia.

A little more than a year after that tsunami killed more than 200,000 people, UK's College of Agriculture has put together a two-year, \$1 million proposal to the federal government to assist three universities in Indonesia to reorganize in the wake of the tsunami devastation. The Gatton-College of Business and Economics, the College of Engineering macy are working on the plan.

The proposal, which will be approved or turned down within the next two weeks, would aid the University of Lampung, Brawijaya University and the University of Syjah Kuala. In Oc-

tober, the University of Syiah Kuala received a \$32,000 donaton, raised by the students, faculty and staff of the College of Agriculture.

This proposal should be approved, and we cannot commend the College of Agriculture enough for their efforts. It matters, and we can all apply the College of Agriculture's initiative to disaster efforts. No matter the type — fire, earthquake, tsunami, flood, hurricane, AIDS pandemic — these issues hit close to home.

SG elections have also had their fair share of mishaps, to say the very least. Disputed results, campaign violations, closed polling places and prolonged recounts have rendered students largely apathetic toward the election process. Unfortunately, it seems that improprieties have come to be an expected part of every SG election.

The SG organization has, for years, consisted primarily of Greeks. In order to have a realistic chance at winning a major election, it seems, a candidate must be affiliated with a fraternity or a sorroity. SG does perform some valuable services for students. Safety walks have raised awareness of campus safety and promoted increases and the same students are also provided with free legal and tax services from the SG office. But as presidential candidate Will Nash said during last year's campaign, "The main role of the president is to be the students' advocate and take student opinions to the board."

No one questions that UK students deserve a voice on the Board of Trustees. But students also deserve better than what they have been receiving from SG for UK's Board of Trustees should dissolve SG. and provide a seat

for years.

UK's Board of Trustees should dissolve SG, and provide a seat for a student trustee by way of

annual election. By having a clearer picture of what candidates' roles will be, more students will be enticed to vote in elections, breaking the Greek monopoly on students university affairs.

Dissolving SG would also saws tudents hundreds of thousands of dollars in fees every year. Why should UK students continue to pay for a bureaucracy when one student trustee is sufficient to perform SG's primary role?

It is unlikely that this action will ever be taken, simply because of the negative PR the move would generate. This is unfortunate for the UK student body. As Winston Churchill wrote, "So they (government) go on in strange paradox, decided only to be undecided, resolved to be irresolute, adamant for drift, solid for fluidity, all-powerful to be impotent."


