Dear Sir:

Herewith enclosed, I hand you fee bill of W. B. Cardwell, ex-Clerk of Breathitt Circuit Court, for his costs in the case in said Court of Ance Robinson v. L&E, amounting to \$4.55. This bill has been approved by Judge Pollard, and I have to ask that voucher may issue in payment.

In the same case, I also hand you herewith bill for judgment and costs and certified copy of judgment, together with Clerk's fee bill for plaintiff and defendant's costs. The total amount recovered by plaintiff is \$106.25 for which a voucher should be drawn payable to J. H. McDaniel, as attorney. A separate voucher for \$5.10 should be drawn payable to W. D. Back, Clerk, in full of defendant's costs.

In this connection, I have indicated on the fee bills what appear to me to be a "splitting" of orders by the Clerk in taxing his costs. In a conference with Judge Pollard at my office today, he informs me that there is practically no help for this at the hands of the court, but if you think an effort should be made to have ~~the~~ taxation revised, the papers should be referred back to Judge Pollard for further attention.
