
Referring to the suit of W. A. Reed vs. L. & E. Railway Company, said to be pending in the Letcher Quarterly Court, though as to that I am not clearly advised, I herewith hand you copy of a letter of the 27th of August from Mr. Moorman, together with the papers therein referred to. Please preserve these in your file.

You will note that Mr. Moorman expressed the opinion that we are not responsible for the loss of plaintiff's goods, but inasmuch as we did not transport them from McRoberts to Hazard, plaintiff is entitled to a refund of the freight paid. The freight payment, as I understand, amounted to \$8.23. Please see if settlement cannot be made on that basis.
