The deposition of Ben McGlossin taken at the law office of Young, Clay & Hogge, pursuant to notice hereto attached, in the City of Morehead, Rowan County, Kentucky, on April 14th 1915, to be read as evidence on behalf of the plaintiff in an action pending in the Letcher Circuit Court, wherein Albert Copley is plaintiff and the Louisville & Nashville Railway Co., et al are defendants.

(It is agreed between the plaintiff and defendant herein that this deposition is to be taken by stenographic notes and that the signature of the witness, Ben McGlossin, is to be waived and all other matters are waived except those going to the exclusion of the deposition or to the competency or relevancy of the testimony therein.)

Witness being first duly sworn states:

Q. Please state your age, residence and occupation?

A. My age is fifty years last Sunday a week ago; Morehead, Ky., and I am a carpenter.

Q. Please state where you were on or about August 30, 1914, if you remember?

A. I don't remember the date at all - all I know, it was on Sunday along about August.

Q. Did you or not ever work at Neon?

A. Yes sir.

Q. While at Neon did you ever have occasion to witness an accident in which Albert Copley lost his limb?

A. Yes sir; I was there that day.

Q. Please state where you were at the time of the accident?

A. I was standing on the rear steps of the rear car of the train.
