Dear Sir:-

In the case of Mike Robinson v. L & E in the Breathitt Circuit Court, involving a claim by the plaintiff for alleged damage to land, caused by the construction of the North Fork Extension, a settlement was lately effected by the payment for the Railway Company of the sum of \$25.00. From all I could learn, there was very little merit in this claim of Robinsons, but it was thought advisable to make settlement of it, as he claimed \$500.00 damages, and it was feared by us that, if we forced him to try, he might somehow manage to get to the jury. My judgment is that it was the prudent thing, under the circumstances, to make the settlement.

For your better information, I herewith hand you a carbon copy of the agreement executed by Mike Robinson and wife to the L & E, the original of which has heretofore been sent to Mr. H. C. Williams, Chief Engineer of Construction. As soon as this copy shall have served your purpose, I shall be obliged if you will kindly return it to me in order that my file of the case may be kept intact.
