Dear Judge:

Confirming my telegram, I desire again to congratulate you on the favorable outcome of the Tharpe case, about which you wired me and about which you have written me in your letter of the 21st. If Judge Riddell has not yet passed upon our Motion for a New Trial in the Reed Thomas case, it seems to me that he ought to sustain that Motion, for certainly if Tharpe was not entitled to recover, the jury ought not to have awarded any damages in favor of Thomas.

Mr. Landrum passed through the office this afternoon and rather gave me to understand that I would not have to return to Jackson before Monday, the 25th instant, at the earliest, with a chance of my not having to come until a still later date.
