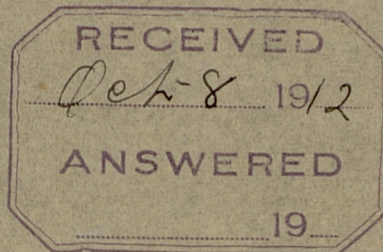

Dear Judge:-

Referring to yours of the 5th to Judge Wilson in regard to my sending you summons in suits in Squire Deaton's court, for stock claims etc. Your statement that there have been more suits filed against us for stock claims on the Extension in the last three months than have been filed on the main line proper, in the last three years is entirely correct.

I agree with you that we should inaugurate a system for handling matters of this kind on the Extension as soon as practical, and I feel sure that with your co-operation we could get matters of this kind on the Extension in the same condition we now have them on the main line.

I think your suggestion to take advantage of every technicality which will delay and discourage suits of this kind is advisable. I will, however, send a copy of this letter to Judge Wilson, and would be glad to have a conference with you two gentlemen on this subject the first time you come to Lexington.
