Apropos of your letter of the 27th instant to Messrs. Morgan & Nuckols, in reference to the suits in Letcher Circuit Court between Jane and Hiram Williams and the L&N RR Co., (BDW-72278) I have recently received from Morgan & Nuckols the original and one carbon copy of the Clerk's transcript of the record in the equity branch of this litigation, together with the Clerk's bill for \$99.80, to cover the cost of same.
