Dear Sir:

I return papers sent me with your letter of April 21st, relative to suit of Jane Williams, seeking to recover damages in the sum of \$3500.00, namely, \$1500.00 for right-of-way taken, and \$2000.00 for damage to her property by reason of the taking and also by reason of changing the channel of the Kentucky River in the construction of our North Fork Extension, which she claims caused damage to her property by wash.

The history of this case is, that at the time right-of-way was being secured for the North Fork Extension, Mr. Jouett, I believe, took option from Mr. Hiram Williams for the right-of-way thru his property. Mr. Williams later refused to make deed, and the claim was set up that a part, at least, of the property optioned belonged to Mrs. Williams individually. We proceeded with the construction of the railroad across the property on the strength of our option, and I believe that suit was
