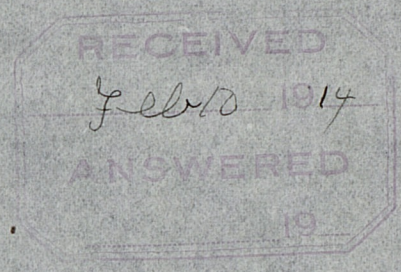

Gentlemen:

Referring to your favor of Feb. 7th relative to the A. J. Wootten Matter.

Upon inquiring of our Treasurer I am advised that the draft heretofore issued in favor of Jackson Wootten, dated Dec. 11th for \$96., contrary to instructions given by me on December 15th, was paid through the Southern National Bank of this city. For that reason the matter has become very much mixed up. Of course, the draft for \$71. should be returned to this office.

On Jan. 29th I forwarded to Judge Wilson and agreed judgment which was drawn up by Mr. Napier in the attachment case of Ewen v. A. J. Wootten then pending in the Jackson Police Court and my understanding is that this judgment has been entered. Inasmuch as Napier & Turner have cashed the draft amounting to \$96. which covered the full amount due Wootten and as we have paid, in accordance with understanding which Mr. Landrum had with Mr. Napier, \$25. in satisfaction of the judgment in the Jackson Police Court, I think that Mr. Napier should refund this amount to us. Will you kindly take the matter up with him with that object in view. Please also return to me as promptly as practicable voucher for \$96. which
