Gentlemen:-

Papers returned received with your letter May, 8th, suit A. C. Baker.

I find that this covers shipment tools moving from Type to Lennut. The shipment was covered by Type to Lennut way-bill 17 of March, 10th. Our Agent Type says that he does not remember the case very clearly at this time but it is possible that the shipment was overlooked on the 10th, and was not given to the local until the 11th, either due to its not having been offered for shipment until after the train had gone or on account of the local being late and on the hours of service.

However, it was forwarded on the 11th, loaded into L&N 2017 and the crew on that date handling arrived at Hazard with only five minutes to spare to prevent the Hours Service Law. The shipment was transferred at Hazard on the 13th, into NYC 10555 and returned to Lennut on #28, March, 14th.

The delay at Hazard was on account of an intervening Sunday and the necessity of working the merchandise car which was handled from Ravenna by the local train picking up merchandise shipments at all stations intermediate.
