Note - 67 small trees cut below the Hoskins Tunnel. These trees are claimed to have been cut by employees of the Jones-Davis Co. They were cut in a logging woods.

Note - 103 small trees cut above the Hoskins Tunnel. Claimed to have been cut by employees of the Jones-Davis Co.

Some rocks thrown here from partial cut about station 1943. This land is covered by beech timber and large boulders, making it un-usable for farming land. No. of acres 6.48

Damaged by blasting  
Rocks from about st. 1943  
Apple trees broken off by falling rocks from partial cut

Land shown by dotted lines is covered by cut soil from each of the slides. This land is 32' wide at top and 10' wide at bottom. No of acres is 2.16.
