

Administration can avoid overcrowding once it's reminded

Monday we were given proof that the system works. The University will rectify institutional wrongs — once it's made aware of them.

This time it took nearly a decade and an article in the Kentucky Kernel before the administration became aware of a flaw in its academic program.

For nine years, Pharmacy 222 — Drugs, Medicine and Society — has been packing students in, literally. At the beginning of the semester 450 students filled the 300 seats in 106 Classroom Building and overflowed into the aisles, doorways and halls.

Monday, however, University officials moved the class to Memorial Hall, where there is more than adequate seating available for the 417 students currently enrolled in the class. Next year R. David Cobb, the class's instructor, will return to the Classroom Building but keep his enrollment at the 300 limit. at the 300 limit

Cobb, an associate professor of pharmacy, said he al-lowed class enrollment to exceed capacity because of the need for students to be exposed to a drug education course. His opinion was good in theory but didn't work so well in

practice.

Although only about 60 percent of students enrolled in an elective course attend, this is not a sound basis for exceeding the classroom capacity. Even the student who infrequently attends class is entitled to a seat.

The importance of being educated about drugs does not outweigh the hardships students must endure in an overcrowded class. Not only did the size of the class pose a possible fire hazard, but it inconvenienced the students unnecessarily.

Students pay to attend classes, where they expect to get a seat; they don't expect to sit on the floor, where it is uncomfortable, difficult to take notes, difficult to see and in the case of bad weather — messy.

In the future, the more than capacity-crowd in Pharmacy 222 can easily be limited by following normal University policy. Upperclassmen have priority when registering for classes. About three-fourths of Cobb's class, however, are sophomores.

By following normal University procedure, the over-crowding problem would be solved. Perhaps the attention this one example has received will assure that the bu-reaucratic process works on its own next time.

"This is just a small way we can show our appreciation to those pioneers," said Senate Majority Floor Leader Joe Wright.

Black schoolchildren end boycott

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — Black students ended two years of school boycotts yesterday and streamed back to classes to prepare for the new academic year on the strength of a pact parents reached with the white-led

government.

Attendance was heavy as schools reopened in urban centers including Johannesburg, Pretoria, Cape Town and Port Elizabeth, where boycotts cut attendance for much of 1094 and 1095. 1984 and 1985

1984 and 1985.

On some days in recent months, more than 200,000 black students boycotted classes out of 1.7 million enrolled in urban areas. The boycotts have been a central factor in 17 months of racial unrest that led to the deaths of more than 1,000 people, most of them blacks.

Outside a school in Johannesburg's huge black township of Soweto, police used tear gas to break up groups of chanting students, residents said. But there were no other reports of trouble, and the fragile accord appeared to have opened the door to normalizing the long-troubled black schools.
