

Note - On account of the sickness of some of the members of the faculty, no meeting was held on March 22, 209

A. and M. College of Kentucky
April 7th 1899.

The faculty met in regular session in the President's room in the College building at 8.30 am

All present except President Patterson and Prof. White. The minutes of the two preceding meetings were read ^{and} approved.

Ordered on motion of Prof. Anderson that the faculty recommends to the Board of Trustees that the degree of Bachelor of Science in Chemistry, Bachelor of Science in Mathematics and Astronomy, Bachelor Science in Zoology, Bachelor of Science in Geology, Bachelor of Science in Physics, and Bachelor of Science in Agriculture, be respectively conferred upon graduates taking the course of Science in Chemistry, Mathematics and Astronomy, Zoology, Geology, Physics and Agriculture.

The only important change, from the present method of conferring degrees, aside from specifying the particular character of the work in Science done in each of the courses, is the change made in the degree of Bachelor of Agriculture to that of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture.

Professor Anderson moved that the faculty recommend to the Executive Committee that the encampment be suspended for this year.

Ordered on motion of Prof. ^{Wk.} Patterson ^{that} Prof. Roark, Anderson and Kastle be appointed a committee to lay the facts before the Executive and explain why the faculty recommend that the encampment be suspended.

The committee on class hours was not ready to report.

Prof. Miller calls attention to the fact that the Schedules to be published in the New Catalogue had not all been handed.

The completion and approval of the Schedules of the courses of study were referred to a Committee composed of the Deans of the Special faculties with power to act. Prof. Miller and Kaste were added to the Committee.
