

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador — Authorities buried many of the 400 victims of El Salvador's earthquake in mass graves, saying a landslide that wiped out entire families had made it impossible to fully know the identities of the dead. Distraught relatives lined up on Sunday at an improvised morgue in a blood-stained alley to identify some of those mangled and entombed in Saturday's 7.6-magnitude quake. But the need to dispose of the mounting number of corpses cheated some of the chance for closure.

LOS ANGELES — A plan to try to fix the energy crisis by making the state a major electricity broker will likely be introduced Tuesday to the state Legislature, officials said. Gray Davis said Sunday the state will try to sign contracts with electricity wholesalers to buy power and sell it to utilities. The state believes it can negotiate better prices than financially unstable utilities, which have amassed billions of dollars in debt buying energy in a California market unhinged by deregulation and supply shortages.

The dead included four members of a U.N. team organizing relief for nomads whose herds—the mainstay of Mongolia's economy—have been decimated



ruled Monday that the premier should have
won the legislature's support before scrapping
a nuclear project, a decision that could force
he leader to resign. In the long-awaited ruling,
the Grand Justices did not specifically say
whether Premier Chang Chun-hsiung violated
the constitution last October when he canceled
the partially built nuclear plant. But the judges
decided that Chang, Taiwan's No. 3 ranking
leader, should have had the legislature's approval before terminating the plant, which was
approved by the former Nationalist Party
government.

recommended Monday's procedure, the Boston
Globe reported. He was taken to New York on
Sunday, Williams is the last major leaguer to bat
400, hitting 406 in 1941.





The sheer number of them—not to mention the surprisingly wide variety of people that patronize them—suggests that the arrival of a new club in town hardly signifies that a city is on a slippery slope to Hell.

However, protesters remain vocal and probably have more pull than you think. Over the past few years, our local government has even joined the fray, legalizing efforts to make it difficult, if not impossible, for club owners and "entertainers" to past week, those efforts have begun to come to fruition.

In the same month that our local media has been clebrating the recent opening of the Nude 2001 art exhibit at a Lexington gallery, city officials have increased the pressure in their latest attempt to push strip clubs out of the city.

A local court ruling handed down Monday ordered that an or-

dinance that has been in the works since 1996 will go into effect in February.

The ordinance states that all strip club owners and dancers comply with a list of rules that not only limit how they're allowed to conduct their business, but also requires them to pay an annual fee to the city to work.

Among the requirements listed under the ordinance: Stages in clubs must be at least list due to the continuous states and the states and clubs are listed under the ordinance: Stages in clubs must be at least list inches high, dancers must stay at least six feet away from club patrons at all times, and clubs can only be open between Junes and clubs can only be open between The states and clubs and pasties and are prohibited from engaging in or simulating sexual acts while performing.

And, in what appears to be the most questionable of the requirements, club owners and entertainers must be licensed through the city, providing detailed information about their work, as well as a physical description and a recent photograph. Club owners must also

pay \$600 a year to remain open, and dancers must pay \$100 annually to keep working in their chessession.

Not only have city officials taken it upon themselves dictate how strip clubs conduct their business (something I would imagine the clubs know how to handle just fine on their own) but they also have arbitrarily required that workers pay a fee simply based on the type of employment they choose to seek—all while collecting the equivalent of a police file on these workers. Exactly where the prohem lies.

Don't get me wrong, Just as I feel strip club workers should be allowed to conduct business in any (legal, of course) way they choose, people do have a right to disagree with the product they peddle. Whether it's for moral reasons, for personal reasons or no reason at all, people have a right to their opinions.

But just as in any other con-

The truth is, strip clubs are here to stay.
