Facebook is being sued by a group of Harvard students who said Mark Zuckerberg, Facebook's creator,
used their idea of an online social directory to create Facebook.

Cameron and Tyler Winklevoss and Divya Narendra worked with Zuckerberg on a now-defunct Web
site called Harvardconnection.com, an online social
network that allowed students to connect according to
their interests, classes and friends.

Narendra and the Winklevosses used the idea to
create a Web site called Connectu.com, a network sim-




