
Byars attended Morehead College, where she showed a strong interest in sports.





Katfish break records

Several pool records and individual top times were posted during the weekend in competition at UK's first men's and women's Swimming and Diving Invitational, held at the Harry C. Lancaster Aquatic Center. In UK's victory performance, Kellie Moran, UK's first female All-America swimmer, broke her own pool record Saturday in the 50-meter freestyle with a time of 23.61, while teammate Wendy Hipskind broke her old pool record in the 200-meter individual medley with a time of 205.80. Moran also set a pool record on Sunday in the 200-meter freestyle, with a time of 1:48.921. The performance marked the first time this year that a Lady Katfish swimmer has beaten the NCAA qualifying time.

The Lady Katfish 400-meter med-ley relay team also broke a pool record, swimming a time of 3:52.84.

UK's men were led by junior

'Behavior' album disappoints critic

Rock bands always possess

Rock Danus astrange names.

Take, for example, the Pet Shop Boys. As curious as the name is, their new album has a boring but appropriate title — Behavior. As might be expected, the LP explores several emotions that accompany humanism, ranging from jealousy to endness.

to sadness.

The Pet Shop Boys first hit the market industry with their single "West End Girls," which immediately soared to the top of Billboard charts. Listeners were intrigued with the interesting combination of a synthesizer and a monotone

tained the characteristics of synth sounds with emphatic statements of life in their next two albums Actually and Introspective.

Now, years later, the Pet Shop Boys have a different style, both good and bad. The positive side consists of the new, more simplistic tyrics, while the negative side is composed of the songs' hard-to-catch rhythms.

The phrases "Why can't I just accept the facts," and "I'm so in love with you" are handled carefully with little instrumentation, allowing the words to punch you in the stomach in the soft love ballad "To Face the Truth." This song is probably the most commercial and the best track off the album because the lyrics pluck at everyone's heartstrings.

Just when you think the group

has finally toned down its fanatical use of synth sounds, the Pet Shop Boys blast that idea out of the water with the song "So Hard." The strong bass notes and metallic sounds make "So Hard" sound so heavy. The rhythms of "So Hard" are difficult to determine because the group changes their meter throughout the song, with little transition to help the listener become accustomed to the weird tempos. That's probably why the audience of a recent "Arsenio Hall Show" did not appreciate "So Hard," because it takes a while to get used to the abrupt rhythm and meter.

The rest of the album is repeti-

The rest of the album is repeti-tious and consists of the same mate-rial. Nevertheless, for every decent song there exists a terrible track.

ment and a joy. The Pet Shop Boys still retain the things they're good at (i.e. synth sounds and clever lyr-ics). But, they obviously think lyr-ics are less important than intricate finger work on the synthesizer. If that's the case, the Pet Shop Boys should consider converting to an all-instrumental group.

For fans of The Pet Shop Boys, buy the album and write to the group about their good traits and faults. If you're not a fan, don't buy the album. Discover the group's strengths in the humorous song "I Want a Dog" from Introspective or in their famous songs from Please and Actually. Avoid this album unless you're planning on learning how to play a synthesizer.





Student trustee should be in on next UK search

The UK Board of Trustees has a chance to improve the way the University looks for a president. UK Student Government Association President Sean Lohman will propose at Tuesday's meeting that student trustees be included on all future presidential search committees. The SGA Senate passed a similar resolution last spring.

Trustees will not vote on the proposal until January because amendments must "sit on the table" for at least 30 days after being proposed to the UK Board of Trustees.

The current process calls for the chairman of presidential searches to name the student representative on the search com-

Lohman said that his amendment is needed to avoid a reoccurrence of problems that the board encountered last January when a search committee was named to select the University's 10th president. Teel Bruner was appointed over Lohman by Trustee Chairman Foster Ockerman, which was perceived as a political move by Ockerman to punish Lohman for not voting the Foster von Ockerman line.

Trustees should consider Lohman's amendment not as an attempt to wrestle control from the board, but as a way to avoid controversy and to ensure that the students are fairly represented on future presidential searches.

In almost all cases, the SGA president sits on the Board of

Trustees as the student trustee. In the event the SGA president is an out-of-state student or picks someone else to sit on the board, the student trustee must be approved by the SGA Senate. Why not ensure that students get a voice in deciding who represents their interests when UK looks for a president?

It is unlikely that any of the current UK trustees will be on the board when UK searches for its 11th president — at least we hope that is the case. Therefore, no one has a political stake in the amendment's outcome -- except future classes of UK students and faculty. By passing Lohman's amendment, trustees will ensure that students' interests will be fairly represent-


