

Court revisits Miranda ruling

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court, confronting its landmark Miranda ruling head-on, agreed yesterday to decide whether police still must warn criminal suspects they have a right to remain silent" and to get a lawyer's help. In 1966, the court sought to remedy "inherently corcive" interrogations by requiring police to inform criminal suspects of their rights before questioning them. But in a surprising ruling earlier this year, the 4th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that a long-ignored 1968 federal law means failure to issue Miranda warnings no longer requires automatic exclusion of evidence in federal prosecutions.

Russia: smash Grozny!

DOLINSKY, Russia — Threatening to unleash a major bombardment on Chechnya's capital Monday, Russia warned residents and rebels living in Grozny to flee before federal forces smash it into submission. Planes dropped leaflets on Grozny that said: "Persons who stay in the city will be considered terrorists and bandits and will be destroyed by artillery and aviation. There will be no further negotiations. Everyone who does not leave the city will be destroyed." Most of the civilians in Grozny — the Russians estimate between 1,5000 and 40,000 remain — are old or infirm. European Union foreign ministers called the warning "an unacceptable threat."

The oil-for-food program allows Iraq to sell limited quantities of oil, in an exception to sell limited quantities of oil, in an exception to buy food, medicine and other essential supplies. The program has routinely been renewed for six months since its inception in December 1996. Under U.N. resolutions, sanctions imposed after Iraq's 1990 invasion of Kuwait are not to be lifted until U.N. inspectors certify that Iraq is free of weapons of mass destruction.







We never want to talk about death. We sometimes think we will live forever. I know the truth.

The difference between dying and thinking you are going to die is life. When you are dead, all thoughts cease to exist. When you think you are going to die solite a VCR — you rewind the accident back to the beginning without pressing any buttons; it just happens. The fear becomes trapped in your mind.

The way that I cope with what almost happened is remembering I have a second chance. The pain and suffering I have endured because of that accident was a blessing in more ways than one.

The one thing I have learned is you must live for you. It doesn't matter what anyone thinks of you, whether it be family or friends.

What counts most is what you think of yourself—we should all live our lies as if this day is our last.
